

**RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
(Supporting S. 229 "Indian Programs Advance Appropriations Act")**

RESOLUTION NO. 19-116

1 **WHEREAS, the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation vests the Legislative Council with**
2 **the authority to "promote, protect and provide for public health, peace, morals,**
3 **education and general welfare of the Tohono O'odham Nation and its members"**
4 **and to "consult with the Congress of the United States and appropriate federal**
5 **agencies regarding federal activities that affect the Tohono O'odham Nation and**
6 **all federal appropriation estimates and projects for the benefit of the Tohono**
7 **O'odham Nation . . ." (Constitution, Article VI, Section 1(c)(2) and Section 1(j)); and**

8 **WHEREAS, beginning December 22, 2018 through January 25, 2019, the U.S. Congress did not**
9 **enact appropriations to fund numerous departments within the Executive**
10 **Branch, including the Department of the Interior, Department of Housing and**
11 **Urban Development, and Department of Homeland Security, resulting in what**
12 **was commonly referred to as a partial government shutdown; and**

13 **WHEREAS, for many tribes across the United States, the 2018-2019 partial government**
14 **shutdown affected access to health care, services and programs provided by the**
15 **Bureau of Indian Affairs, and financial reimbursements and funding for**
16 **important tribal programs; and**

17 **WHEREAS, on January 25, 2019, Senator Udall introduced S. 229 "Indian Programs Advance**
18 **Appropriations Act," which would authorize advance appropriations for the**
19 **Department of the Interior Operation of Indian Programs, contract support**
20 **costs, the Indian Guaranteed Loan Program Account, and advance**
21 **appropriations for the Department of Health and Human Services, Indian Health**
22 **Service; and**

23 **WHEREAS, the Health and Human Services and Appropriations Committees reviewed S. 229**
24 **and recommends its support.**

25 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council supports S.**
26 **229 "Indian Programs Advance Appropriations Act" or similar legislation that**
27 **would provide advance annual appropriations for the Department of the Interior**
28 **and Department of Health and Human Services for tribal programs funding.**

29 **The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council on the 04TH**
30 **day of APRIL, 2019 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 3,084.6 FOR; -0-**
31 **AGAINST; -0- NOT VOTING; and [03] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by**
32 **Article VI, Section 1(c)(2) and Section 1(j) of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation,**
33 **adopted by the Tohono O'odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy**
34 **Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the**
35 **Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.984).**
