

RESOLUTION OF
THE
PAPAGO COUNCIL

NO. 141

WHEREAS it has been brought to the attention of the Papago Council by the members of the Council reporting for the Papagos in their various districts that Dr. E. F. Tritt, Field Physician in the Papago Reservation, has been of invaluable aid in administering medical services and creating interest in the health program of the Papago Reservation; and,

WHEREAS it is felt by the members of the Papago Council that Dr. Tritt has done everything possible to fulfill the requirements of the Field Physician under the present plan of operation; and,


WHEREAS the Indians of the Papago Tribe greatly respect and admire Dr. Tritt who has won their confidence,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that we respectfully request the Commissioner of Indian Affairs to consider the recommendation of the Papago Tribal Council that Dr. Tritt be retained on the Papago Reservation as Field Physician and that he be given a salary increase commensurate with the salary increase which he would receive in accept- in the transfer which is being offered him to another position in the Indian Service.

The foregoing Resolution was on February 1, 1941 duly enacted by a vote of 18 for, and 0 against, by the Papago Council, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 3 (f), Article V, of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of Sells Agency, subject to its rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6, Article V. of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
