

THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RESOLVED by the Papago Council that we hereby approve and endorse the testing of all horses on the Papago Reservations for Dourine, and;

RESOLVED FURTHER THAT all re-actors found during the testing shall be disposed of and shall be paid for by fair and reasonable appraisals made by a committee selected for that purpose, and;

RESOLVED FURTHER that the work of this project shall be carried out as far as possible in accordance with an ordinance of the Papago Tribe which shall be drawn up to insure the proper and entire cooperation of the Papago Tribe in connection with the eradication of Dourine and the lifting of quarantine on the Papago Reservation.

The foregoing resolution was on March 19, 1941 duly enacted by a vote of 9 for and 3 against, by the Papago Council pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 3 (k), Article V, of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on Dec. 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on Jan. 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its enactment, and of its approval by the Superintendent of Sells Agency, subject to its rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6, Article V. of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe.
