

RESOLUTION OF
THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

No. 146

RESOLVED by the Papago Tribal Council that we appropriate, and there is hereby appropriated the sum of Five Hundred (\$500.00 Dollars from the fund, "I. I. M. Acct. No. P-84, Contributed Fund, Papago Tribe", to be used as a revolving fund for the purchasing of groceries in wholesale lots, taking advantage of any and all discounts, so that those districts wishing to make use of any savings for their men, which might come from the cooperative feeding of the cowboys who will work in the round-ups in connection with the eradication of Bourine on the Papago Reservations, may have an opportunity to do so, and;

PROVIDED that when the eradication of Bourine from the Reservation shall have been completed, and the quarantine lifted from the reservations, this sum of money shall revert back to the fund, "I. I. M. Acct. No. P-84, Contributed Fund, Papago Tribe."

The foregoing Resolution was on April 5, 1941, duly enacted by a vote of 18 for, and 0 against, by the Papago Council, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 3, (a), Article V, of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of Galls Agency, subject to its rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6, Article V. of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe.
