

RESOLUTION OF

PAPAGO COUNCIL

No. 178

RESOLVED by the Papago Tribal Council that we appropriate, and there is hereby appropriated the sum of Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars from the fund, "I. I. M. Acct. No. F-54, Contributed Fund, Papago Tribe", to be used together with the funds appropriated by Resolution No. 146 of the Papago Tribal Council enacted under date of April 5, 1941, as a revolving fund for the purchasing of groceries in wholesale lots, taking advantage of any and all discounts, so that those districts wishing to make use of any savings for their men, which might come from the cooperative feeding of the cowboys who will work in the round-ups in connection with the eradication of Sourine on the Papago Reservations, may have an opportunity to do so, and;

PROVIDED that when the eradication of Sourine from the Reservation shall have been completed, and the quarantine lifted from the reservations, this sum of money shall revert back to the fund, "I. I. M. Acct. No. F-54, Contributed Fund, Papago Tribe.", and;

PROVIDED FURTHER that we appropriate, and there is hereby appropriated the sum of Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars, from the fund, "I. I. M. Acct. No. F-54, Contributed Fund, Papago Tribe", to be used for buying a spool of rope which shall be made available for sale to those cowboys wishing to buy rope for use in connection with the round-up work to be carried on, and;




PROVIDED that when the eradication of Sourine from the Reservation shall have been completed, and the quarantine lifted from the reservations, this sum of money shall revert back to the fund, "I. I. M. Acct. No. F-54, Contributed Fund, Papago Tribe."

The foregoing Resolution was on May 3, 1941, duly enacted by a vote of for and 0 against, by the Papago Council, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 3(a), Article V, of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934, (48 Stat. 904). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of Sells Agency, subject to its rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6, Article V, of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
