

RESOLUTION OF
THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

No. 151

RESOLVED by the Papago Council that we hereby approve a grant of right-of-way for the construction of 11.45 section of road within the Papago Reservation beginning at the western end (designated as engineer's station 297 & 67.63) or the right of way granted by resolutions No. 13 of the Papago Council enacted under date of October 2, 1937, and No. 24, enacted under date of March 5, 1938, and to terminate 11.45 miles further west in the vicinity of San Vicente Ranch; and,

PROVIDED that the right-of-way shall be not more than 100 ft. in width; and

PROVIDED FURTHER that no fencing of the right-of-way will be done except and with the approval and consent of the Papago Council; and

PROVIDED FURTHER that all individual or community property which it will be necessary to change, molest, or in any way alter, shall be repaired or replaced and shall be left in a condition satisfactory to the parties concerned; and

PROVIDED that no gasoline stations, lunch stands, or other businesses shall be operated within the right-of-way, neither shall there be bill posters or other unsightly structures erected along the roadway.

The foregoing Resolution was on June 14, 1941, duly enacted by a vote of 13 for, and 0 against, by the Papago Council pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 3 (d) Article V. of the Constitution of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to section 16 of the Act of June 13, 1934 (48 Stat. 924). Said Resolution to be effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of Sells Agency, subject to its rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6, Article V. of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe.
