

RESOLUTION OF  
THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

No. 163

RESOLVED by the Papago Council that we hereby approve and confirm the entering into of an agreement between the Papago Tribe, represented by the Papago Tribal Council, and Mrs. Isabel Lejero, widow of Pablo Lejero, in which the Papago Tribe shall have use of the land known as the Alahambra Valley to which the Lejero family had prior right.

PROVIDED THAT this agreement shall conform to conditions set forth in written agreement signed by Mrs. Isabel Lejero on September 8, 1941 at Sells Agency, Sells, Arizona.

PROVIDED FURTHER that all business transacted under this resolution shall be taken care of by a committee selected by the Chairman of the Papago Tribal Council and confirmed and approved by vote of the Papago Council in their meeting of September 24, 1941.

The foregoing Resolution was on September 24, 1941, duly enacted by a vote of 7 for, and 0 against, by the Papago Council, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 3 (d), and 3(k), Article V. of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Sells Agency, subject to its rescission by the Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6, Article V, of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
