13		their Ethnographic Overview project and their ongoing Mission 2000 database of

16		Nation, individually and through District presentations, so their advice, counsel and				
17	r	assistance can become important elements of this project; and				
18	WHEREAS,	the National Park Service appreciates and understands sensitivity issues regarding				
19		certain types of information and will respect matters of confidentiality.				
20	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Nation strongly supports the					
21		efforts of the National Park Service to prepare an Ethnographic Overview of the				
22		Tumacacori National Historical Park that will provide a more complete				
23		documentation of the important role of the O'odham and other Native Peoples in the				
24		history and development of these early mission communities.
