

**RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
(Support for Funding in FY 2001 Federal Appropriations for Increased Indian School
Equalization program and Facilities Funding for BIA Schools Serving the Tohono
O'odham Nation)**

RESOLUTION NO. 2000-141

1 **WHEREAS, there is a chronic and growing lack of funds to accomplish preventive maintenance**
2 **at schools; and**

3 **WHEREAS, improvements needed at school facilities are related to health and safety, security,**
4 **and increased educational opportunities; and**

5 **WHEREAS, the schools have unmet, unfunded needs to improve communication and instruction**
6 **through the use of technology; and**

7 **WHEREAS, curriculum alignment to meet State standards within the Bureau operated schools**
8 **and with the local public schools will require a large outlay of money to provide**
9 **appropriate textbooks and supporting materials; and**

10 **WHEREAS, key positions needed at each school to provide quality educational programs have**
11 **not been filled because the Indian School Equalization Program (ISEP) does not**
12 **provide enough funds to pay the salary costs; and**

13 **WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs Office of Indian Education Programs on the Tohono**
14 **O'odham Nation has identified funding needs totaling \$7,550,000 for facilities**
15 **upgrading and maintenance, and \$2,160,000 for improving education services in the**
16 **Bureau operated schools.**

17 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that it hereby**
18 **calls upon Congress and the White House to set funding for Facility Management and**
19 **Indian School Equalization Programs on the Tohono O'odham Nation at a level that**
20 **includes funding for the items described in the supporting documents.**

21 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Appropriations Committee is hereby authorized and directed**
22 **to bring this request to the appropriate Agencies, Members and Committees of**
23 **Congress.**

24 **The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council on the 21ST. day**
25 **of MARCH, 2000 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 2,165.5 FOR; -0-**
26 **AGAINST; -0- NOT VOTING; and [02] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by**
27 **Section 1 (j) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'Odham Nation, adopted by the**
28 **Tohono O'Odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant**
29 **Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June**
30 **18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).**




