1	WHEREAS,	the Tohono O'odham Nation ("Nation"), in exerecise of its sovereign authority, desires
2		to manage and regulate the storage, collection, recycling, transportation and
3		disposal of solid waste and certain hazardous waste on lands within the boundaries
4		of the Nation in order to protect the environment, the natural resources, the political
5		integrity and economic security of the Nation, and the health, safety and welfare of
6		its members and persons present on the Nation's lands; and
7	WHEREAS,	the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council ("Legislative Council") adopted the Solid
8		Waste Management Code and Solid Waste Management Plan ("Plan") on February 12,
9		1997, which in part, established the Solid Waste Management Program, ("SWMP");
10		and
11	WHEREAS,	SWMP has implemented the section of the Plan by creating weekly solid waste
12		collection from 700 bins serving over 100 villages, businesses and agencies and
13		hauling, on an average, 330 tons of solid waste per month to EPA permitted landfills
14		located off of the Nation's lands; and
15	WHEREAS,	SWMP originally serviced 9 of the 11 districts but now provides bulky waste removal
16		for San Xavier District and is discussing the same services with San Lucy District; and
17	WHEREAS,	SWMP has only four solid waste drivers, and only four solid waste collection trucks
18		to pick-up all of the Nation's trash including household, commercial, bulky waste,
19		construction debris, scrap metal, recyclable paper and tires; and
20	WHEREAS,	SWMP relies on occasional laborers to do clean up and repair on 700 solid waste bins;
21		and
22	WHEREAS,	SWMP has contracted with TOUA for administrative services for solid waste billing
23		and has been notified by TOUA that they want to stop providing the service as of
24		October 01, 2000; and
25	WHEREAS,	SWMP needs one additional office worker to help in the transition to in-house bill
26		preparation and collecting overdue solid waste bills; and
27	WHEREAS,	SWMP has collected fees for services and recycling revenue from the sale of
28		recyclables and these funds have been deposited in a dedicated account
29		#000252452099 with the Bank of America as directed in Resolution No. 98-236, and
30		said resolution states that the funds are to be used for program expenditures; and

1	WHEREAS, SWMP is finding that with both its assigned work and additional requests for							
2	expanded services, that SWMP can not complete everything it is asked to do.							
3	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council hereby approves							
4	the use of program revenues, in the amount of \$285,000.65, for the purchase of							
5	additional equipment consisting of bin delivery truck, general service pick-up trucks,							
6	roll-off truck, bins and ancillary equipment as needed.							
7	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if the capital equipment is not deliverable by September 30, 2000							
8	the Chairman is authorized to roll forward funding for major capital equipment into							
9	FY-01 and make payments when equipment is received.							
10	BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that there is created three additional positions, (one supervisor, one							
11	solid waste driver, one accounts receivable clerk), and that three occasional laborer							
12	positions are upgraded to full time positions, and be funded by program revenues in							
13	the FY-00; and that the new and upgraded positions will become part of the SWMP's							
14	base budget and be funded by program revenues for FY 2000/2001.
