RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL (Opposition to Provisions in Arizona Water Settlements Act Imposing State Law and Jurisdiction on Future Trust Lands Acquisitions)

RESOLUTION NO. 01-031

1	WHEREAS,	on October 24, 2000, the Arizona Water Settlements Act of 2000 (the "Arizona Act") was
2		introduced in the United States Senate (S. 3231) and House of Representatives (H.R.
3		5529); and
4	WHEREAS,	included in the Arizona Act as Titles II and III, respectively, are water settlements for
5		the (1) Gila River Indian Community (the "Community") designated as the Gila River
6		Indian Community Water Rights Settlement Act of 2000 (the "Community Settlement
7		Act") and (2) the Tohono O'odham Nation (the "Nation") designated as the Southern
8		Arizona Water Rights Settlement Amendments Act of 2000 (the "Nation Settlement
9		Act"); and
10	WHEREAS,	the Nation Settlement Act is intended to implement the Southern Arizona Water
11		Rights Settlement Act of 1982, Public Law 97-293 (96 Stat. 1261) and finally resolve the
12		Nation's water claims in the Tucson basin; and
13	WHEREAS,	Section 211 of the Community Settlement Act establishes certain preconditions to
14		future acquisitions of trust lands outside the exterior boundaries of the Community's
15		Reservation ("Future Trust Lands") which are implemented through
16		Intergovernment Agreements ("IGA's") between the Community and the State of
17		Arizona, as well as Arizona Counties, Municipalities and Irrigation Districts; and
18	WHEREAS,	Section 211 and the IGA's (1) impose Arizona laws to define and regulate the
19		Community's water rights, land use, public services and certain other rights of the
20		Community related to use of the Future Trust Lands; (2) provide for exclusive State
21		Court jurisdiction over any disputes arising under the IGA's and require the
22		Community to waive its immunity from suit in State Court; (3) mandate payment by
23		the Community of State, County and Municipal property taxes; and (4) extinguish any
24		Community claims to federal reserved rights on water resources associated with the
25		Future Trust Lands; and
26	WHEREAS,	Section 211 provides that the Secretary of Interior is (1) bound by the IGA's; (2)
27		foreclosed from abrogating the IGA's in administrative or judicial proceedings; (3)
28		only authorized to intervene in State Court proceedings regarding disputes under the

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1		IGA's; and (4) prohibited from seeking to remove any dispute to Federal Court; and
2	WHEREAS,	
3		Water Resources, made a presentation to the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council
4		regarding the application of provisions comparable to Section 211 and the IGA's to
5		
6		(1) the Nation Settlement Act and (2) the Gila Bend Indian Reservation Lands
		Replacement Act, Public Law 99-503 (100 Stat. 1798) (the "Nation Lands Replacement
7		Act"); and
8	WHEREAS,	the Nation Lands Replacement Act confirms a settlement of the Nation's claims for
9		an unconstitutional taking by the United States of lands within the Gila Bend Indian
10		Reservation and provides specific standards for taking replacement lands into trust;
11		and
12	WHEREAS,	the discretion of the Secretary of the Interior, as well as the procedures and
13		standards applicable to placing lands into trust for Indian nations, are prescribed in
14		and exclusively governed by existing federal law and regulations; and
15	WHEREAS,	adoption of the procedures and standards in Section 211 and the IGA's for Future
16		Trust Lands would (1) divest the Secretary of any meaningful discretion now
17		recognized under federal law; (2) substitute State law for Federal law in determining
18		whether and on what terms lands would be taken into trust; and (3) virtually
19		extinguishes tribal regulatory and judicial jurisdiction over Future Trust Lands; and
20	WHEREAS,	application of these principles to Indian nations as a condition to securing the water
21		settlements contemplated by the Arizona Act is (1) an unwarranted and selective
22		modification of federal law on trust land acquisitions; and (2) a fundamental
23		intrusion on the affected Indian nation's sovereign rights of self-government which
24		the United States, as trustee, is legally bound to foster, support and protect under
25		longstanding Federal policy and law; and
26	WHEREAS,	the Nation has in the past, and intends to continue in the future, to enter into
27		mutually acceptable intergovernmental and cooperative agreements with State and
28		Federal governmental agencies and other entities on subjects of common concern.
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1	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:						
2	1. The Tohono O'odham Legislative Council opposes and will reject any application						
3	to the Southern Arizona Water Rights Settlement Amendments Act of 2000 of the						
4	provisions, or comparable provisions, of Section 211 of Title II of the Arizona Act						
5	and the related Intergovernmental Agreements.						
6	2. The Legislative Council opposes and will reject any application to the Gila Bend						
7	Indian Reservation Lands Replacement Act, Public Law 99-503 (100 Stat. 1798) of						
8	the provisions, or comparable provisions, of Section 211 of Title II of the Arizona						
9	Act and the related Intergovernmental Agreements.						
10	3. The Legislative Council urges the United States Congress, the President and						
11	related agencies to assure that any amendments to the current procedures and						
12	standards in Federal law on taking lands into trust be accomplished in a manner						
13	which conforms to the United States' trust responsibility to Indian nations and						
14	allows due deliberation, comment and participation by the Tohono O'odham						
15	Nation and other Indian nations.
