

RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
(Support for funding in FY 2002 Federal Appropriations for increased Indian
School Equalization Program and Facilities funding for BIA schools serving
the Tohono O'odham Nation)

RESOLUTION NO. 01-082

1 **WHEREAS, there is a continuing lack of funds to accomplish preventive maintenance at schools;**
2 **and**

3 **WHEREAS, improvements needed at school facilities are related to health and safety, security,**
4 **and increased educational opportunities ; and**

5 **WHEREAS, the schools experience belated funding and unfunded needs for maintenance and**
6 **repair of quarters at school locations; and**

7 **WHEREAS, curriculum alignment to meet State standards within the Bureau operated schools**
8 **and with the local public schools will require a large outlay of money to provide**
9 **appropriate textbooks and supporting materials; and**

10 **WHEREAS, key positions needed at each school to provide quality educational programs have**
11 **not been filled because the Indian School Equalization Program (ISEP) does not**
12 **provide enough funds to pay the salary costs; and**

13 **WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs Office of Indian Education Programs on the Tohono**
14 **O'odham Nation has identified funding needs totaling \$13,775,000 for facilities**
15 **upgrading and maintenance, and \$2,345,200 for improving education services in the**
16 **Bureau operated schools.**

17 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that it hereby calls**
18 **upon Congress and the Administration to set funding for Facility Management and**
19 **Indian School Equalization Programs on the Tohono O'odham Nation at a level that**
20 **includes funding for items described in the supporting documents; and that it**
21 **provide quarters collections in a timely manner to Education programs.**

22 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Appropriations Committee is hereby authorized and directed**
23 **to bring this request to the appropriate Agencies, Members and Committees of**
24 **Congress.**

25 **The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council on the 28TH Day**
26 **of FEBRUARY, 2001 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1,999.6 FOR; -0-**
27 **AGAINST; -0- NOT VOTING; and 165.9 [03] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by**
28 **Section 1 (j) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'Odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono**
29 **O'Odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary -**
30 **Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48**
31 **Stat. 984).**


