## **RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL** (Requesting Continued Support for Requesting Reimbursement to Indian Health Service Unit for Cost of Treating Non-Native Individuals)

## RESOLUTION NO. 01-207

1	WHEREAS,	the National Congress of American Indians through Resolution No. STP-00-051	
2		supported the Tohono O'odham Nation in requesting reimbursement to the Indian	
3		Health Service Unit for cost of treating non-Native individuals; and	
4	WHEREAS,	the Indian Health Services (IHS)operates service units throughout the United States	
5		in Indian Country and these service units are intended to provide medical care to	
6		federally recognized American Indians and Alaska Natives; and	
7	WHEREAS,	these units are accredited by the Joint Commission on the Accreditation of Hospitals	
8		Organizations (JCAHO) and are therefore required to adhere to the Emergency	
9		Medical Treatment and Active Labor Act (EMTALA); and	
10	WHEREAS,	the EMTALA dictates that anyone in need of emergency care cannot be refused care	
11		regardless of ability to pay and that patients must be treated until stabilized or	
12		transferred to another facility; and	
13	WHEREAS,	IHS service units have increasingly provided medical services to non-American	
14		Indians and Alaska Natives in need of emergency care including many thousands of	
15		individuals that are brought to these service units by the United States Border Patrol;	
16		and	
17	WHEREAS,	the Indian Health Service is funded by Congressional appropriation but is not funded	
18		at a level of need required by American Indians and Alaska Natives; and	
19	WHEREAS,	IHS service units have incurred substantial costs from treating non-American Indian	
20		and Alaska Natives patients brought to these units by the United States Border Patrol	
21		and are therefore eligible for reimbursement which has not yet been provided; and	
22	WHEREAS,	the failure to reimburse IHS service units for these medical care costs at a time when	
23		American Indians and Alaska Native patients are funded below their level of need	
24		substantially reduces the available resources for American Indians and Alaska	
25		Natives patients.

1	NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council does hereby							
2	urge the National Congress of American Indians to address the expense associated							
3	with treatment of non-American Indians or Alaska Natives patients.							
4	BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council does hereby request							
5	that the United States Department of Justice and the Immigration and Naturalization							
6	Service consult with Federally recognized tribes in an effort to increase reimburse-							
7	ment for services provided to non-Natives at the Indian Health Service.
