RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL (Request for Allocation of Funding for Housing to Support the San Simon Health Center Under the Provisions of the Indian Health Service Facility Construction System)

RESOLUTION NO. 01-364

1	WHEREAS,	the Tohono O'odham Nation is indigenous to Southern Arizona. The Tohono O'odham
2		Reservation spans a territory of over 2.8 million acres and is the second largest Native
3		American Reservation in the mainland United States. The enrolled population of the
4		Nation is approximately 22,000. There are approximately seventy (70) inhabited
5		villages in this arid desert land; some sparsely populated; some extremely remote and
6		reachable only on unpaved roads. Distances to the nearest health care facility for
7		some villages can exceed 90 miles. The median income is below poverty level and is
8		among the lowest of all Native American communities; and
9	WHEREAS,	villages in the western region of the Tohono O'odham Nation are further apart, vary
10		in size, are more likely to have unpaved roads and are considered remote in terms of
11		access to health care and other economic and social services; and
12	WHEREAS,	villages may be located 90 miles away from the closest I.H.S. facility and the Tohono
13		O'odham members seek medical attention and treatment later than members closer
14		in proximity to health care facilities; and
15	WHEREAS,	I.H.S. has long identified the need for health care services in the western region; and
16	WHEREAS,	the Indian Health Service conducted a Program Justification Document for Staff
17		Quarters and the Housing Verification Survey Report for Staff Quarters in 1996 that
18		identified 49 new Full Time Equivalent (FTE) positions for the proposed Westside
19		Health Center; and
20	WHEREAS,	the Housing Verification Survey Report established that the nearest available housing
21		for staff working at the proposed Westside Health Center is located 42 miles away and
22		that there is virtually little or no publicly owned or new housing developments in the
23		area; and
24	WHEREAS,	the Indian Health Service Documents did identify the need for construction of the
25		following housing units: one single family two bedroom units and two single family
26		three bedroom units; two single family handicap accessible three bedroom units and
27		one handicap accessible four bedroom unit; four - one bedroom multi-family units,
28		three-one bedroom multi-family units, ten - two bedroom multi-family units and four

1	- one bedroom transient units for a total of 27 housing units; and				
2	WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation supports this request for appropriation as submitted to				
3	provide funding to construct housing that is necessary for staff so that the San Simon				
4	Health Center can be operational once it is constructed.				
5	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that it hereby				
6	requests appropriation in the amount of \$219,000.00 for design and \$4,577,000.00 for				
7	construction of the 27 multi-purpose staff housing units for the proposed San Simon				
8	Health Center.

10	of <u>JULY, 2001</u> at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of <u>2,417.5</u> FOR; <u>-0-</u> AGAINST;

14	(Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
