11		been filled because the Indian School Equalization Program (ISEP) does not provide
12		enough funds to pay the salary costs; and
13	WHEREAS,	the Bureau of Indian Affairs Office of Indian Education Programs on the Tohono
14		O'odham Nation has identified funding needs totaling \$13,775,000 for facilities
15		upgrading and maintenance, and \$2,345,200 for improving education services in the
16		Bureau operated schools.
17	NOW, THER	REFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that it hereby calls

20		funding for the items described in the supporting documents; AND that it provide
