# **RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL** (Repealing Resolution No. 94-098 and Adopting a New Gaming Revenue Distribution Formula)

### DEFEATED RESOLUTION NO. 01-445

1	WHEREAS,	the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council enacted the Ordinance for the Regulation of
2		Gaming Activities within the Tohono O'odham Nation (the "Nation") pursuant to
3		Resolution No. 93-296, as amended by Resolution Nos. 97-168, 97-303 and 99-206 (the
4		"Gaming Ordinance"), which authorized the conduct of Gaming Activities (as that term
5		is defined in the Gaming Ordinance); and
6	WHEREAS,	Section 302 of the Gaming Ordinance requires that net revenues received by the
7		Nation from all Gaming Activities be utilized for funding government operations or
8		programs of the Nation or Districts, providing for the general welfare of the Nation and
9		its members, promoting the Nation's economic development, benefitting charitable
10		organizations providing services within the Nation, and making per capita payments
11		to enrolled members of the Nation, subject to compliance with all applicable laws of
12		the United States and the Nation; and
13	WHEREAS,	by Resolution No. 93-311, the Nation adopted a Charter which established the Tohono
14		O'odham Gaming Authority ("Gaming Authority") as the enterprise of the Nation
15		charged with managing and operating all Gaming Facilities (as that term is defined in
16		the Gaming Ordinance); and
17	WHEREAS,	by Resolution No. 94-098, the Legislative Council adopted a formula (the "1994
18		Formula") to allocate all revenue from Gaming Facilities paid to the Nation by the
19		Gaming Authority pursuant to Section 7(d) of the Gaming Authority Charter (the
20		"Gaming Revenues"); and
21	WHEREAS,	it is in the Nation's best interest to repeal Resolution 94-098 and modify the 1994
22		Formula to better meet the needs of its members.
23	NOW, THE	REFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:
24		1. Resolution No. 94-098 is repealed; provided that, as authorized and directed by
25		Resolution 94-098, the budget, audit and internal control procedures for
26		expenditure of the "District Allocation" (as defined in Resolution No. 94-098 and
27		this Resolution) were developed and adopted by the Legislative Council pursuant
28		to Resolution No. 95-397 and shall continue to remain in full force and effect

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1	unless or until such procedures are modified by the Legislative Council.
2	2. On a monthly basis, ten percent (10%) of all Gaming Revenues shall be allocated
3	(the "Monthly Allocations") to a separate account established and known as the
4	Permanent Fund Trust Account (the "Permanent Fund Trust") which shall be
5	segregated from all other sources of revenue.
6	(a) The Monthly Allocations shall be used to make long-term investments in
7	accordance with the Nation's Financial Investment Policy (the "Investment
8	Policy") adopted by the Legislative Council pursuant to Resolution No. 91-042
9	and as amended by Resolution No. 01-213 and any Resolution thereafter
10	approved by the Legislative Council.
11	(b) All investment earnings on the Permanent Fund Trust (the "Investment
12	Earnings") shall be reinvested in long-term investments in accordance with
13	the Investment Policy.
14	(c) The term "Permanent Fund Trust Principal" shall mean the sum of Monthly
15	Allocations and Investment Earnings required to realize Investment
16	Earnings sufficient to (1) fund the annual budgets of the Legislative, Judicial
17	and Executive Branches of the Nation's government and (2) sustain and
18	preserve the Permanent Fund Trust Principal.
19	(d) The Permanent Fund Trust Principal shall be retained in the Permanent
20	Fund and shall not be subject to appropriation or expenditure.
21	(e) Funds in excess of the Permanent Fund Trust Principal which meet the
22	requirements of clause (c) shall be available for appropriation by the
23	Legislative Council for the purposes described in such clause.
24	(f) The combined Monthly Allocations and Investment Earnings which are less
25	than the Permanent Fund Trust Principal shall not be appropriated or
26	expended under any circumstances.
27	3. The fund balance in the Nation's Desert Diamond Savings Account (No. 1067514)
28	(the "Savings Account") as of September 30, 2001 shall be transferred to the Cost
29	Center Trust Account (the "Cost Center Trust") which shall be the new name for
