RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL (Supporting Federal Legislation Recognizing the Tohono O'odham Nation's Inherent Sovereign Authority and Appointing National and State Representatives)

RESOLUTION NO. 01-558

1	WHEREAS,	from time immemorial, the Tohono O'odham have governed their aboriginal
2		territory as a distinct, independent political entity having jurisdiction over its
3		territory, its members and all other Indians and non-Indians who came within that
4		territory; and
5	WHEREAS,	the Tohono O'odham Nation has never surrendered its inherent powers of self-
6		governance to the United States of America by treaty, conquest or otherwise; and
7	WHEREAS,	the people of the Tohono O'odham Nation, as members of a federally recognized
8		Indian tribe with inherent powers of self-governance, have adopted a Constitution
9		reaffirming the Nation's inherent sovereign authority and its jurisdiction over all
10		lands, all people, and all activities within the boundaries of the Nation consistent with
11		federal law (Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation, Article I); and
12	WHEREAS,	the United States of America has determined for itself that the United States
13		Congress, through the Indian Commerce Clause of the United States Constitution (art.
14		1, § 8, cl. 3), has the constitutional authority to enact laws concerning Indian tribes;
15		and
16	WHEREAS,	the permanent government-to-government relationship between Indian tribes and
17		the United States is memorialized in numerous treaties, executive orders,
18		agreements, and statutes that recognize the sovereign status of Indian tribes; and
19	WHEREAS,	during the last three decades, the United States Supreme Court, acting without the
20		guidance and direction of the Congress, has issued a long series of opinions
21		drastically eroding the inherent sovereign authority of tribes to regulate, adjudicate,
22		and legislate within their territorial boundaries; and
23	WHEREAS,	Indian tribes throughout the United States have begun to meet and cooperatively
24		draft federal legislation aimed at: 1) reaffirming the inherent sovereign powers of
25		Indian tribes; 2) reversing anti-tribal sovereignty Supreme Court decisions beginning
26		with <u>Oliphant v. Suquamish Indian Tribe</u> and culminating with <u>Nevada v. Hicks</u> ; and ¹

1		3) providing Indian tribes with an option as to the extent of jurisdiction each tribe
2		chooses to assert over its territory as well as over the activities and persons within
3		that territory; and
4	WHEREAS,	it is in the Nation's interests to develop and adopt a position on these important
5		issues and to designate representatives to present its positions at the state and
6		national levels.
7	NOW, THEI	REFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that the
8		inherent sovereign powers of the Tohono O'odham Nation shall extend to all lands,
9		all people, and all activities within the boundaries of the Nation.
10	BE IT FURT	THER RESOLVED that the Nation's sovereign powers may only be limited by the
11		Nation itself or by the legislative acts of United States Congress, but not by the
12		Supreme Court of the United States acting pursuant to federal common law.
13	BE IT FUR	THER RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Nation urges the United States
14		Congress to pass legislation recognizing and affirming that (1) Indian tribal powers
15		of self-governance are <i>inherent</i> powers and are not delegated by the Congress and
16		(2) the government-to-government relationship between Indian tribes and United
17		States is permanent, (3) tribal courts are courts of general jurisdiction with full rights
18		of appeal, and (4) Indian tribes shall have, at their option, full civil and criminal
19		jurisdiction, which shall encompass full regulatory, adjudicative, and legislative
20		authority over all lands and activities within their boundaries, including over fee
21		lands, regardless of ownership.
22	BE IT FURT	HER RESOLVED that the Nation supports the national Tribal Sovereignty Protection
23		Initiative as a means of responding to the numerous Supreme Court opinions
24		undermining tribal sovereignty.
25	BE IT FURT	THER RESOLVED that the Nation reserves its final approval of the draft legislation
26		currently being developed by the Legislative Options Subcommittee of the Tribal
27		Sovereignty Protection Initiative until a final bill becomes available.

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1	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Legislative Council Representative Evelyn Juan is hereby	
2	designated as the Nation's national spokesperson and representative and is	
3	authorized to present the Nation's views, positions, and proposals protecting and	
4	affirming the Nation's inherent tribal sovereignty at the national level.	
5	BE 1T FURTHER RESOLVED that Legislative Council Representative Ambrose Encinas is hereby	
6	designated as the Nation's Arizona spokesperson and representative and is	
7	authorized to present the Nation's views, positions, and proposals protecting and	
8	affirming the Nation's inherent tribal sovereignty within the State of Arizona.	
9	BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that, in order for the Nation to speak with one voice, the Nation's state	
10	and national sovereignty protection representatives shall confer with and report	
11	back to the Nation's three governmental branches.

12	The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council on the 07^{TH} . Day	
13	of <u>NOVEMBER, 2001</u> at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of <u>2,132.75</u> FOR;	
14	<u>284.75</u> AGAINST; <u>-0-</u> NOT VOTING; and [<u>04]</u> ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council	
15	by Section 1 (f),(c)(1), and (c)(6) of Article IV of the Constitution of the Tohono O'Odham Nation,	
16	adopted by the Tohono O'Odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy	
17	Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act	
18	of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
