

**RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
(Establishing December as Drunk and Drugged Driving Prevention Month)**

RESOLUTION NO. 01-573

1 **WHEREAS, Tohono O'odham encounter challenges to their spirit, emotional, mental and physical**
2 **well being from sources that exist outside O'odham culture and tradition; and**

3 **WHEREAS, each life is precious and each life lost in a motor vehicle crash represents a substantial**
4 **and personal loss to family, friends and the Tohono O'odham Nation; and**

5 **WHEREAS, the economic cost of motor vehicle crashes results in fewer health care dollars and in**
6 **incalculable years of potential lives lost; and**

7 **WHEREAS, alcohol and substance abuse are contributing factors in highway deaths; and**

8 **WHEREAS, the prevention of drunk and drugged driving is a goal that requires continuous**
9 **vigilance, community support and education on a daily basis; and**

10 **WHEREAS, the dedication of December to the memory of all motor vehicle crash victims will set**
11 **a permanent, annual date in which to bring together and focus all of our prevention**
12 **efforts.**

13 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that December of 2000 and each December hereafter, is**
14 **hereby proclaimed as Drunk and Drugged Driving Prevention Month and is dedicated**
15 **to the memory of all motor vehicle crash victims.**

16 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all branches and employees of the Tohono O'odham Nation work**
17 **together with government agencies, churches, communities, businesses, health**
18 **providers and schools in order to end driving under the influence.**

19 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a ribbon tied to a vehicle antenna shall symbolize the**
20 **commitment to sober driving over the holidays and throughout the new year.**

21 **BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that the Chairman of the Nation, together with the appropriate**
22 **Committees of the Council and Departments of the Executive Branch, the Indian**
23 **Health Service, the Districts and concerned individuals, develop an O'odham-sensitive**
24 **and O'odham appropriate alcohol prevention and education video.**

25 **The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council on the 09TH, Day**
26 **of NOVEMBER, 2001 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 2,273.0 FOR; -0-**
27 **AGAINST; -0- NOT VOTING; and 144.5[07] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by**
28 **Section 1 (c)(8) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'Odham Nation, adopted by the**
29 **Tohono O'Odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant**
30 **Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June**
31 **18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).**
