8	WHEREAS, the prevention of drunk and drugged driving is a goal that requires continuous
9	vigilance, community support and education on a daily basis; and
10	WHEREAS, the dedication of December to the memory of all motor vehicle crash victims will set
11	a permanent, annual date in which to bring together and focus all of our prevention
12	efforts.
