RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL (Amending Resolution No. 01-518, "Approving FY 2002 P.L. 93-638 Grant for Solid Waste Dump Clean Up and Closures")

RESOLUTION NO. 01-594

1	WHEREAS,	the Tohono O'odham Nation ("Nation"), in exercise of its sovereign authority, desires
2		to manage and regulate the storage, collection, recycling, transportation and
3		disposal of solid waste and certain hazardous waste on lands within the boundaries
4		of the Nation in order to protect the environment, the natural resources, the political
5		integrity and economic security of the Nation, and the health, safety and welfare of
6		its members and persons present of the Nation's lands; and
7	WHEREAS,	the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council ("Legislative Council") adopted the Solid
8		WasteManagementCodeandSolidWasteManagementPlan("Plan")onFebruary12,
9		1997, (Resolution 97-041) which in part, established the Solid Waste Management
10		Program, ("SWMP"); and
11	WHEREAS,	SWMP has implemented Chapter 4 of the Solid Waste Code by creating a weekly solid
12		waste collection service from 700 bins located in over 100 villages, (including
13		Florence Village and San Lucy Farm), businesses and agencies and hauling, on an
14		average, 425 tons of solid waste per month to EPA permitted landfills located in Casa
15		Grande and Tucson; and
16	WHEREAS,	SWMP will begin closing some of the 113 old dump sites to meet T.O.N. and USEPA
17		dump closure standards for health, environment and public safety, (Resolution #01-
18		518); and
19	WHEREAS,	SWMP planned to lease/purchase a crawler tractor for \$175,000 over a 48 month
20		period for dump closure but has located a used-reconditioned crawler tractor from
21		the Tohono O'odham Farming Authority for \$55,000 which will accomplish the same
22		purpose and save the program \$120,000 thereby enabling the SWMP to close more
23		dump sites; and
24	WHEREAS,	SWMP will be purchasing this equipment with a one time payment of \$55,000; and
25	WHEREAS,	the Solid Waste Advisory Committee has met monthly for ten years to first develop the
26		solid waste plan and the solid waste code and then provided guidance to both the

1	SWRO and SWMP in program implementation and now will provide advice and
2	direction in dump closure activity; and
3	WHEREAS, the Executive Branch, in an effort to reduce spending of tribal funds has reduced per
4	diem line item amount by 66% from the 01-1097 SWMP budget; and
5	WHEREAS, the Solid Waste Advisory Committee will play a critical role in coordinating
6	community wide clean-ups in conjunction with community dump closures, and
7	assisting SWMP on maintaining an accurate and updated customer mailing list.
8	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that line item 750 - Major Capital be created in the
9	Dump Closure Budget 10-1097 and \$77,000 be allocated to this line item.
10	BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that line item 640 - Committee Fees and 661 - Mileage POV be added to
11	the existing dump closure 10-1097 budgets, and funded an amount to enable the
12	advisory committee to meet four times per year (once per quarter), to assure regular
13	interaction and communication of the solid waste advisory committee with SWMP
14	and SWRO.
