1	WHEREAS,	on November 21, 2001 the 10hono of odnam Legislative Council passed Resolution No.

4	WHEREAS,	on November 28, 2001 the National Congress of American Indians unanimously
5		adopted Resolution #SPO-01-006, which also opposed the creation of the Bureau of
6		Indian Trust Asset Management ("BITAM"); and
7	WHEREAS,	both the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council and National Congress of American
8		Indians resolutions urge the United States Congress to reject reallocation of FY 2002
9		monies to accommodate the BIA/BITAM reorganization proposal; and
10	WHEREAS,	on December 6, 2001, the Nation received a copy of a November 20, 2001 letter from P.
11		Lynn Scarlett, the Department of the Interior ("DOI") Assistant Secretary for Policy,
12		Management, and Budget, to United States Senator Robert C. Byrd, Chairman,
13		Subcommittee on Interior and Related Agencies, Committee on Appropriations
14		("Reprogramming Request"); and
15	WHEREAS,	in the Reprogramming Request, Assistant Secretary Scarlett notified Chairman Byrd
16		that DOI planned "to transfer approximately \$100 million from the Office of the
17		SpecialTrusteeandapproximately\$200millioninprogramfundingfromtheBureau
18		of Indian Affairs," as well as additional, undisclosed amounts "for general
19		${\bf administrative\ and\ financial\ functions\ and\ for\ trust-related\ contracts\ and\ compacts"}$
20		to fund the BIA/BITAM reorganization; and
21	WHEREAS,	reprogramming these monies would allow the DOI to proceed with the reorganization and the proceed with the reorganization and the proceed with proceed w
22		$over strong \ tribal\ opposition, and \ regardless\ of the\ likely\ reduction\ in\ funds\ available$
23		for existing trust management functions; and
24	WHEREAS,	neither Assistant Secretary Neil McCaleb nor Deputy Secretary J. Steven Griles
25		revealed that the Reprogramming Request had been made when they addressed
26		Tohono O'odham Nation officials and other tribal leaders at the National Congress of
27		American Indians' 58th Annual Session on November 27 and 28, 2001; and
28	WHEREAS,	these undisclosed acts and repeated, misleading statements by DOI officials suggest
29		the Department of the Interior has no intention of truly consulting with Indian tribes

2	will proceed regardless of any tribal input or opposition; and				
3	WHEREAS, pursuant to House and Senate Appropriation Subcommittee procedures, DOI may				
4	reprogram funds as described in the Reprogramming Request if no action is taken by				
5	the Interior Appropriations Subcommittee Chairmen within thirty days.				
6	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council reaffirms its				
7	opposition to the DOI/BIA reorganization proposal and urges that both the Senate and				
8	House Interior Appropriations Subcommittees reject the Reprogramming Request				
9	from the Department of the Interior.				
10	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Nation respectfully requests that those tribes				
11	opposing the BIA/BITAM reorganization immediately contact their respective federal				
12	congressional delegations to request that the Reprogramming Request be denied.				
13	BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that copies of this resolution shall be transmitted to members of th				
14	Senate Select Committee on Indian Affairs.
