

RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
(Approving a Memorandum of Understanding between the Tohono O'odham Nation,
the Tohono O'odham Community College and the State of Arizona for Arizona
Proposition 301 Funds)

RESOLUTION NO. 02-067

1 **WHEREAS, the Arizona voters did approve Proposition 301 (Laws 2000, 5th S.S. Chapter 1), which**
2 **provides that a percentage of transaction-privilege tax revenues collected by the**
3 **State of Arizona shall be directed to improving education funding and accountability;**
4 **and**

5 **WHEREAS, Proposition 301 funds also may be distributed for the exclusive purpose of providing**
6 **support to one or more community colleges owned, operated or chartered by a**
7 **qualifying Indian tribe, so long as the monies are used for workforce development**
8 **and job training purposes; and**

9 **WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation is a federally recognized Indian Tribe organized**
10 **pursuant to Section 16 of the Indian Reorganization Act of 1934, 25 U.S.C. 476, and is**
11 **a qualified Indian Tribe under Proposition 301; and**

12 **WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Community College ("TOCC") was chartered by Tohono O'odham**
13 **Legislative Council Resolution No. 96-422 as a community college, and is therefore**
14 **eligible to receive Proposition 301 funding; and**

15 **WHEREAS, the TOCC, the State of Arizona and the Nation have negotiated a Memorandum of**
16 **Understanding, as attached and incorporated by this reference, that sets forth the**
17 **understandings and responsibilities of the parties for both the disbursal and receipt**
18 **of Proposition 301 funding.**

19 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council hereby**
20 **approves the attached Memorandum of Understanding between the Tohono O'odham**
21 **Community College, the Nation and the State of Arizona and authorizes the Chairman**
22 **of the Nation to execute said Memorandum.**

23 **BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that any and all Proposition 301 funds shall be directed into a specific**
24 **bank account designated by and in the name of the Tohono O'odham Community**
25 **College and that the State of Arizona be provided timely notice of said account by**
26 **TOCC.**

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The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council on the 08TH Day of FEBRUARY, 2002 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 1,890.8 FOR; -0- AGAINST; -0- NOT VOTING; and 526.7 [13] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Section 1 (f) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'Odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'Odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
