

RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
(Reaffirming Resolution No. 01-368 passed by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council in
support of an appropriations request to the U.S. Congress to fund counter narcotic efforts
by the Tohono O'odham Nation Police Department)

RESOLUTION NO. 02-142

1 **WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation with a land base of 2.8 million acres and a population of**
2 **23,000 members contracts to provide its own Law Enforcement, Corrections, and**
3 **Ranger programs; and**
4 **WHEREAS, providing law enforcement and related public safety services is recognized as a**
5 **critical function of the sovereign Tohono O'odham Nation Government; and**
6 **WHEREAS, it is recognized that the Tohono O'odham Nation Police Department continues to**
7 **investigate narcotic related offenses and crimes that occur within the Tohono**
8 **O'odham Nation; and**
9 **WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation Legislative Council approved Resolution No. 01-368 in**
10 **calendar year 2001 to request an appropriation from the United States Congress in**
11 **the amount of \$1,273,574.00 to fund counter narcotic efforts required by the**
12 **challenges of the International Border with the Republic of Mexico; and**
13 **WHEREAS, it is understood and appreciated by United States Federal Law Enforcement Agencies**
14 **that the Tohono O'odham Police Department personnel provide valuable effort in the**
15 **United States counter narcotic strategy; and**
16 **WHEREAS, it is acknowledged that the border related counter narcotic efforts of the Tohono**
17 **O'odham Nation Police Department have had a negative impact on the Police**
18 **Department's ability to provide community based service; and**
19 **WHEREAS, the Tohono O'Odham Nation should receive Federal funding to compensate it for the**
20 **cost of the special activities required by the flow of narcotics across the International**
21 **Border with Mexico; and**
22 **WHEREAS, adding two Police Sergeants, Six Police Officers, One Ranger Supervisor and Four**
23 **Rangers to the Police Department will assist in dealing with Border related narcotic**
24 **law enforcement efforts; and**
25 **WHEREAS, the cost of these personnel additions with required equipment will be \$1,273,574.**
26 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council**
27 **that it hereby reaffirms Resolution No. 01-368 and again authorizes the Chairman of**
28 **the Nation, together with the Appropriations Committee, to seek an appropriation**
