ı	WHEREAS,	in the 1997 Balanced Budget Act (PL 105-33), the United States Congress created the
2		Special Diabetes Programs for Indians (SDPI), mandating funding of \$30 million
3		annually via grant programs designed to prevent and treat diabetes in Indian
4		Country through fiscal year 2002; and
5	WHEREAS,	the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council, through Resolution 98-149, approved the
6		Community Based Diabetes Prevention Program, the Tohono O'odham Nation's SDPI
7		${\bf program administered through the Tohono O'odham Department of Human Services;}$
8	·	and
9	WHEREAS,	the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council, through Resolution 2000-182, renamed the
10		Community Based Diabetes Prevention Program to the Healthy O'odham Promotion
11		Program (HOPP); and
12	WHEREAS,	for HOPP to succeed in its mission to prevent diabetes, additional funds are required
13		to build infrastructure and train staff to change the health behavior of at least one
14		generation of the Tohono O'odham in order to incorporate a diabetes risk prevention
15		lifestyle; and
16	WHEREAS,	continuing the SDPI at its current \$100,000,000 appropriation beyond FY 2003 would
17		greatly benefit the Tohono O'odham Nation's efforts through the HOPP in preventing
18		diabetes.
19	NOW, THER	EFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that:
20		1. It hereby requests that the U.S. Congress continue funding the Special Diabetes
21		Programs for Indians beyond FY 2003; and
22		2. The Appropriation Committee of the Council is hereby directed to lobby the U.S.
23		Congress to seek continued funding for the Special Diabetes Programs for Indians
24		beyond FY 2003 at its current appropriation of \$100,000,000; and
25		3. The Chairman of the Nation is hereby authorized to enter into any agreements as
26		may be required for the Nation to receive such funding.
