6	WHEREAS,	Article VI - Powers of the Tohono O'odham Council, Section 1, (8) states "to preserve					
7		and cultivate native arts, crafts and traditions; and					
8	WHEREAS,	the United States Administration for Native Americans (ANA) announced the					
9		availability of fiscal year 2002 funds to assist applicants in designing projects, to					
10		promote the survival and continuing vitality of Native American languages; and					
11	WHEREAS,	the Tohono O'odham Community Colleges (TOCC) is applying for a \$50,000 ANA					
12		planning grant to conduct a one year survey study on the Tohono O'odham Nation to					
13		determine Tohono O'odham language proficiency in homes, communities, places of					
14		employment and in educational institutions on the Nation; and					
15	WHEREAS,	on March 15, 2002, the TOCC Board of Trustees approved the submission of the ANA					
16		Planning Grant Application in the amount of \$50,000.					
17	NOW, THER	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that it hereby					
18		supports and approves the submission of an Administration for Native Americans					
19		language planning grant in the amount of \$50,000 by the Tohono O'odham					
20		Community College.

22		O'odham Community College and the Tohono O'odham Nation.
