1	WHEREAS,	the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council is vested with the power to consult with
2		otherIndiantribesonallmatterswithintheCouncil'sauthority(ConstitutionoftheCouncil'sauthority)
3		Tohono O'odham Nation, Article VI, Section 1(f)); and
4	WHEREAS,	the Nation is an active member in good standing with the National Congress of
5		American Indians (NCAI), which is the oldest and largest national organization of
6		American Indian and Alaska Native tribal governments; and
7	WHEREAS,	on May 17, 2002, the NCAI proposed an amended dues structure based upon tribal
8		revenue that would increase tribal dues by up to 4000%; and
9	WHEREAS,	the proposed dues increase is excessive, has not been adequately justified, and would
10		unfairly burden smaller tribes; and
11	WHEREAS,	the dues proposal should properly be addressed at the 2002 NCAI Annual Session
12		when a larger number of NCAI tribes will be present and able to voice their positions
13		and concerns.
14	NOW, THER	EFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council hereby opposes
15		amending Section III of the NCAI By laws at the 2002 Mid-Year Session to increase NCAI and the the
16		membership dues and supports delaying any changes to membership dues until the
17		2002 NCAI Annual Session.
18	BE IT FURT	HER RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council respectfully requests
19		that tribes from the Phoenix Area and all other Areas join in opposing any
20		membership dues increase during the 2002 Mid-Year Session or any future increase
21		without adequate justification to the NCAI's membership.
22	BE IT FURT	HER RESOLVED that the Legislative Council calls upon the NCAI to provide a single
23		report to the membership (1) a detailing NCAI's expenditures and (2) adequately
24		justifying the amount of the proposed membership dues increase based upon those
25		expenditures before the 2002 Annual Session.
26	BE IT FUR	THER RESOLVED that the Legislative Council hereby requests that the NCAI
27		analyze and report on the reasons for the reduction in the number of member tribes
28		and the resulting reduction in membership dues before the 2002 Annual Session.
29	BE IT FINA	ALLY RESOLVED that the Legislative Council hereby encourages the NCAI to
30		recruit additional tribes into its membership as many non-member tribes benefit
31		from NCAI's advocacy.
