

**RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
(Supporting the Establishment of a Family and Child Education Program at the
Santa Rosa Boarding & Day School)**

RESOLUTION NO. 02-323

1 **WHEREAS, the Legislative Council is vested with the power to “promote, protect and provide for**
2 **... education and general welfare of the Tohono O’odham Nation and its members”**
3 **(Constitution of the Tohono O’odham Nation, Article VI, Section 1(c)(2)); and**

4 **WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Office of Indian Education Programs, operates four**
5 **schools on the Tohono O’odham Nation which are funded through federal**
6 **appropriations and grants; and**

7 **WHEREAS, the Office of Indian Education Programs has funds available through the Family and**
8 **Child Education Program (“FACE Program”) to improve the literacy and cognitive**
9 **development of children ages 0 - 5 years; and**

10 **WHEREAS, the FACE Program would also benefit the young children of the Nation by preparing**
11 **them to enter kindergarten, improving their math and reading skills, and increasing**
12 **their school attendance; and**

13 **WHEREAS, the FACE Program would also provide parents of young children with parenting skills**
14 **and other training designed to help create a supportive learning environment within**
15 **the family; and**

16 **WHEREAS, the Santa Rosa Boarding & Day School Administration has identified available**
17 **classroom and office space for the FACE Program, has reviewed the Program’s**
18 **guidelines, has contacted the Tohono O’odham Community College to develop**
19 **parenting skills courses for participating parents, and has applied for a FACE**
20 **Program grant; and**

21 **WHEREAS, implementation of the FACE Program would benefit O’odham children and families.**

22 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O’odham Legislative Council strongly**
23 **supports the development and implementation of the FACE Program at Santa Rosa**
24 **Boarding & Day School to better educate O’odham children and support O’odham**
25 **families.**

26 **The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O’odham Legislative Council on the 15TH. Day**
27 **of JULY, 2002 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 2,256.8 FOR; -0- AGAINST;**
28 **160.7 NOT VOTING; and [07] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Section 1**
29 **(c)(2) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O’Odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono**
30 **O’Odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary -**
31 **Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48**
32 **Stat. 984).**




