1	WHEREAS,	the Tohono O'odham Nation enacted a Wage Determination pursuant to Resolution
2		No. 01-028 (Adopting a Wage Determination for Commercial Construction, Residential
3		Construction, and Heavy Construction projects within the boundaries of the Tohono
4		O'odham Nation) in 2001 to protect the wages of workers generated from projects
5		occurring within the Nation's boundaries; and
6	WHEREAS,	as a general rule, the requirements of the Wage Determination apply to <u>all</u> persons,
7		as that term is defined in the Resolution, who operate within the boundaries of the
8		Nation, unless that person is specifically exempted from the coverage of the Wage
9		Determination; and
10	WHEREAS,	Section 5 of the Wage Determination contains categories of specific situations where
11		persons are exempted from the coverage of the Wage Determination; and
12	WHEREAS,	Section 1 of the Wage Determination requires that contractors and subcontractors pay
13		their workers, at a minimum, the wages and cash in lieu of benefits as specified by the
14		Wage Determination; and
15	WHEREAS,	subsection D of Section 5, provides an exemption for contractors and subcontractors,
16		who are bound to collective bargaining agreements, from paying "cash in lieu of
17		benefits" where wages are established by the collective bargaining agreements; and
18	WHEREAS,	notwithstanding the existence of a collective bargaining agreement, employees
19		referred by the TERO Office to a contractor or subcontractor covered by the Wage
20		Determination should have the option to: 1) choose to receive cash in lieu of benefits;
21		or 2) receive benefits in accordance with the provisions of a collective bargaining
22		agreement, if applicable; and
23	WHEREAS,	the collective bargaining agreement exemption contained in subsection D of section
24		5 might provide union signatory contractors with the basis to deny tribal members the
25		choice to either accept cash in lieu of benefits or to accept fringe benefits as a part of
26		their wage package; and
27	WHEREAS,	subsection D of Section 5 needs to be amended to clarity that fringe benefits will be
28		paid in accordance with the wishes of the TERO referred employees; and
29	WHEREAS,	subsection F of Section 5, providing an exemption for an entity utilizing its own

1	employees on projects, might be interpreted as allowing such entity an exemption for						
2	all projects the entity is involved in, not just that entity's personal construction						
3	projects; and						
4	WHEREAS, subsection F of Section 5 needs to be modified to exempt for Wage Determination						
5	coverage only those projects which constitute projects performed by an entity for that						
6	entity's own interests.						
7	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that Resolution						
8	01-028, Adopting A Wage Determination, is amended as follows:						
9	Section 5: Exemptions						
10	D. Projects where wages are set by a collective bargaining agreement, except that						
11	no collective bargaining agreement shall prevent employees referred by TERO						
12	from exercising the option to either: 1) accept cash in lieu of benefits; or 2) receive						
13	benefits in accordance with the provisions of a collective bargaining agreement,						
14	as modified.						
15	F. Projects performed with the existing employees of an otherwise covered entity for						
16	that entity's own construction projects.
