(Authorizing expenditure of funds for the continued operation of U.S. Bureau of Indian Affairs programs previously contracted pursuant to P.L. 93-638 into Fiscal Year 2003)

RESOLUTION NO. 02-449

1	WHEREAS,	the Master Contract (No. 1450CTH54T61071), between the Tohono O'odham Nation
2		and the U.S. Department of Interior ("DOI"), as approved by Resolution No. 96-281 of
3		the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council, and as extended by Resolution Nos. 99-342
4		and 02-261, as amended, expired on September 30, 2002; and
5	WHEREAS,	by Resolution No. 02-261, the Nation submitted a proposal to extend the Master
6		Contract for an additional three years; and
7	WHEREAS,	the DOI through its Bureau of Indian Affairs ("BIA") declined to accept the Nation's
8		proposal to extend the Master Contract in contravention of applicable law; and
9	WHEREAS,	by Resolution No. 02-448, legal action for relief from the BIA's declination was
10		authorized; and
11	WHEREAS,	pending resolution of legal action contemplated by Resolution No. 02-448, funding
12		from the BIA for Fiscal Year 2003 will cease; and
13	WHEREAS,	it is in the best interest of the Tohono O'odham Nation that the programs, functions,
14		$services \ or \ activities \ previously \ performed \ by \ the \ Nation \ under \ the \ Master \ Contract$
15		continue to operate; and
16	WHEREAS,	the  Nation's  Department  of  General  Support  Services,  Of fice  of  Grants  and  Contracts,
17		${\bf has\ identified\ that\ sufficient\ funds\ exist\ to\ continue\ to\ operate\ programs, functions,}$
18		services or activities previously performed by the Nation under the Master Contract
19		for a maximum of one hundred and eighty days from October 1, 2002.
20	NOW, THER	EFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:
21		1. The Legislative Council hereby authorizes the continued operation of those
22		${\bf programs, functions, services\ or\ activities\ previously\ performed\ under\ the\ Master}$
23		Contract for a maximum of one hundred and eighty days from October 1, 2002,
24		through expenditure of Tribal funds and 638-carryover funds; and
25		2. The Chairman of the Nation shall provide Legislative Council with notice as to the
26		status of said programs and available funds, as necessary; and
27		3. The Chairman of the Nation shall seek reimbursement from the BIA of all funds
28		the Nation expends for the continuation of BIA programs, functions, services or
29		activities performed under the Master Contract.
