3		border environment to work cooperatively toward sustainable development through
4		protection of human health and the environment and proper management of natural
5		resources; and
6	WHEREAS,	there are many Native American Tribes along the US-Mexico border which have a
7		deep and abiding concern for the environment in this border region, as they have
8		lived here from time immemorial and still have strong cultural and familial ties to
9		the land and people on both sides of the border; and
10	WHEREAS,	the right of Tribes to participate as equal partners in the Border XXI process was
11		recognized in May, 1999 in the "Border XXI Coordination Principles"; and
12	WHEREAS,	the United States Environmental Protection Agency Region IX has funded two Tribal
13		Border Environmental Coordinator positions, one in California and one in Arizona;
14		and
15	WHEREAS,	the Arizona position serves the Tohono O'odham Nation, the Pascua Yaqui Tribe, the
16		Cocopah Tribe, and the Quechan Tribe, by ensuring that each Tribes' issues are
17		presented to the Border XXI Coordinators; by keeping Tribes informed of Border XXI
18		resources and activities; and by working with Tribes and Border XXI entities to
19		address specific Tribal border environmental issues; and
20	WHEREAS,	the Tohono O'odham Nation has so far, been awarded \$100,000 in Assistance
21		Agreement No. X-989336-01, entitled "US Mexico Border Project - Environmental
22		Coordinator Program,"; and
23	WHEREAS,	an additional \$25,000 in EPA funding has been directed to the Nation for the
24		continuation of this program.
25	NOW, THER	EFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council hereby approves
26		the application for \$25,000 as an amendment to Assistance Agreement No. X-989336-
27		01.
28	BE IT FURT	HER RESOLVED that the Chairman or his designee is authorized to extend the Tribal
29		Border Environmental Coordinator contract pursuant to this Assistance Agreement.
30	BE IT FINA	LLY RESOLVED that Council authorizes the expenditure of funds according to the
31		attached budget.
