5		Citizenship Act such as, but not limited to, visiting each of the one hundred twenty-						
6		two cosponsors in the 107th Congress and requesting that they join as cosponsors on						
7		the new legislation; and						
8	WHEREAS,	there is \$14,935.39 remaining from a \$100,000.00 Appropriation made in October,						
9		2000 from Gaming Savings as a set-aside to be used to obtain Mexican passports and						
10		U.S. laser visas for Tohono O'odham members born and presently residing in Mexico;						
11		and						
12	WHEREAS,	nearly 1,000 Mexican passports and U.S. laser visas were processed and the \$14,935.39						
13		is the balance remaining in this account; and						
14	WHEREAS,	since these funds were appropriated to facilitate a temporary solution to border						
15		travel, it is consistent to authorize that this remaining balance be applied to the						
16		Citizenship Campaign to achieve a permanent (rather than temporary) solution for						
17		all members of the Tohono O'odham Nation; and						
18	WHEREAS,	the Fort Mojave Tribe did contribute the sum of \$250.00 to the Tohono O'odham						
19		Citizenship Campaign which was received on November 21, 2002.						
20	NOW, THER	EFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that:						
21		1. The Executive Office is authorized to expend the funds described herein, to wit:

23		the \$14,935.39 is hereby transferred as carryover funds from FY 2001 to FY 2003						
24 25		from the Visa/Passport Project to the Citizenship Campaign, and, accepting the \$250.00 gift from the Fort Mojave Tribe for the purposes noted in the following
