13		nominated and supported the appointment of HHS Committee Chairman Albert						
14		Manuel, Jr. to the Advisory Council; and						
15	WHEREAS,	Councilman Manuel's term on the Advisory Council will end on January 15, 2003; and						
16	WHEREAS,	the Health and Human Services Committee recommends that its Chairman, Albert						
17		Manuel, Jr., be re-appointed to the Advisory Council and requests that the Tohono						
18		O'odham Legislative Council support this nomination.
