5		Ordinance"), Ordinance No. 03-86, which identifies the roles of the Tohono O'odham
6		Election Board and the Legislative Council in the initiative process; and
7	WHEREAS,	pursuant to Article XII of the Election Ordinance, the Election Board has certified
8		Initiative Petition No. IN-03-02, "Adopting Cultural Center/Museum site Legislative
9		Council Resolution No. 2000-275 appropriating \$15,191,080.00 for the construction,
10		staffing and operation of a Cultural Center Museum" ("Initiative"); and
11	WHEREAS,	in accordance with Article XII, Section 7(D)(1), of the Election Ordinance, the Election
12		Board did (1) notify the Legislative Council Chairwoman of the Petition and Board
13		certification on December 20, 2002, (2) file the Petition with the Legislative Council
14		on the same date, and (3) request that the Council either adopt the Initiative Measure
15		or call a special election within ninety (90) days of receiving the Petition; and
16	WHEREAS,	pursuant to Article XII, Section 9(A), of the Election Ordinance, the Legislative Council
17		"shall either adopt the initiative measure by a majority vote without alteration or
18		shall call for a special election to be held not later than ninety days after the petition
19		was filed with the council"; and
20	WHEREAS,	the Legislative Council has reviewed the Initiative Petition No. IN-03-02 and its
21		accompanying Initiative Measure.
22	NOW, THE	REFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council
