(Accepting and Authorizing Expenditure of a \$6,760,181.00 United States Department of Justice Grant to Construct a Joint Correctional Facility as a Multi-Year Capital Project)

RESOLUTION NO. 03-031

1	WHEREAS,	the Legislative Council is empowered by Article VI, Section 1(c)(1) and (c)(2) of the
2		Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation to govern the conduct of members of the
3		Tohono O'odham Nation and other persons within its jurisdiction; and to promote,
4		protect and provide for public health, peace, morals, education and general welfare
5		of the Tohono O'odham Nation and its members; and
6	WHEREAS,	the present Bureau of Indian Affairs adult corrections facility on the Nation was
7		originally constructed to house thirty-four inmates, but now has an inadequate
8		capacity and contains no available space for expansion to develop educational or
9		treatment programs for inmates; and
10	WHEREAS,	the present juvenile corrections facility is also overcrowded and is in need of
11		rehabilitation program space to treat youthful drug- and alcohol-related offenders;
12		and
13	WHEREAS,	in response to these issues, a partnership between the Judicial Branch and the Tohono
14		O'odham Police Department was formed for the purpose of developing and
15		constructing an Adult and Juvenile Joint Correctional Facility ("Joint Correctional
16		Facility") to house both adults and juveniles; and
17	WHEREAS,	a technical committee comprising the Judicial Branch, Police Department, Office of
18		the Attorney General and the Nation's Planning Department was also formed to
19		conduct research and planning necessary to fund and construct the Joint Correctional
20		Facility; and
21	WHEREAS,	the technical committee has proposed the Joint Correctional Facility be constructed
22		in Phases, with an application for Phase I to be submitted; and
23	WHEREAS,	in accordance with Resolution 99-059, the Council authorized the Executive Branch
24		to submit a grant fund application to the United States Department of Justice ("DOJ")
25		to construct a Joint Correctional Facility; and
26	WHEREAS,	the Executive Branch by letter to the United States Attorney General approved the
27		submission of the grant application to the DOJ for the construction of the Joint
28		Correctional Facility; and
29	WHEREAS,	the Judicial Branch and Tohono O'odham Police Department partnership has applied
30		for and was awarded a grant for Phase I in the amount of \$6,760,181.00 from the DOJ,

12	WHEREAS, the DOJ, in awarding the grant, awarded the project funds for a period not to exceed	d
13	forty-eight months and provided a disbursement budget by categories ("Disbursemen	
14	Budget") as noted in the attached September 30, 2002 award notice and letter fron	
15	Office of Justice Programs Comptroller Cynthia J. Schwimer to Chairman Edward D	
16	Manuel Regarding Grant Number 2002-IP-BX-0003; and	
17	WHEREAS, the Disbursement Budget has been placed in tribal format and designated the	e
18	Correctional Facility on Tribal Land Grant Budget ("Correctional Facility Budget"), and	
19	is before the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council for its approval; and	
20	WHEREAS, these funds will be used to develop, design and construct the Joint Correctional	
21	Facility; and	
22	WHEREAS, the Domestic Affairs, Judiciary, and Budget and Finance Committees have been	
23	provided and reviewed a Tribal Correctional Facility Grant packet; and	
24	WHEREAS, the Legislative Council supports the goal of providing treatment and healing	
25	programs for those who are serving a jail sentence; and	
26	WHEREAS, the Legislative Council further supports the continuing effort to jointly plan,	
27	design, implement, construct and operate a modern Joint Correctional Facility	- 1
28	capable of appropriately serving the unique needs of both juveniles and adults and the	
29	effort to reduce facility's cost by sharing support facilities and infrastructure; and	
30	WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 99-059, the Legislative Council must approve the receipt	
31	and expenditure of these grant funds.	

RESOLUTION NO. 03-031 (Accepting and Authorizing Expenditure of a \$6.760.181.00 United States Department of Justice Grant to Construct a Joint Correctional Facility as a Multi-Year Capital Project) Page 3 of 4 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council hereby approves the receipt of the United States Department of Justice \$6,760,181.00 Correctional Facility on Tribal Land Grant. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislative Council hereby approves the attached Disbursement Budget and Correctional Facility Budget, both of which include the 10% in-kind contribution of \$751,133.00. The in-kind contribution when combined with the United States Department of Justice Correctional Facility on Tribal Land Grant provides a total project cost of \$7,511,314.00. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Nation may, as needed, request to adjust the award amount through the Department of Justice not to exceed the original grant award amount and 10 each request to adjust the award shall be reviewed for consistency with the project's 11 goals and objectives. 12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council that the Chairman is 13 authorized to accept, negotiate, and execute any documentation associated with 14 exercising the acceptance and implementation of the Correctional Facilities on Tribal 15 Lands Discretionary Grant Program. 16 BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that the grant and respective budgets are designated as a multi-year 17 capital project not to exceed forty-eight months unless otherwise amended and 18 approved by the U.S. Department of Justice and the Tohono O'odham Legislative 19 Council and the Executive Branch, in association with the Judicial Branch, are 20 authorized to implement the project according to the provisions of governmental 21 22 GAAP. The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council on the 10^{TH} . Day 23 of <u>JANUARY, 2003</u> at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of <u>2,417.5</u> FOR; <u>-0-</u> 24 AGAINST; <u>-0-</u> NOT VOTING; and <u>[02]</u> ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by 25 Section 1 (c)(1), (c)(2), (d)(2) & (d)(3) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'Odham Nation, 26 adopted by the Tohono O'Odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy 27 Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act 28 of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). 29 **30** TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL 31 32 33 Rita A.
