7	WHEREAS,	providing law enforcement and related public safety services is a critical function of
8		the Tohono O'odham Nation; and
9	WHEREAS,	the TOPD investigates illegal trafficking in narcotics and undocumented immigrant
10		related offenses and crimes that occur on the lands of the Tohono O'odham Nation;

12	WHEREAS,	the TOPD investigates the deaths of undocumented immigrants and provides rescue
13		services to distressed immigrants in distress while crossing the Nation's land; and
14	WHEREAS,	the TOPD'sCommunityPolicingeffortsaremademoredifficultandchallengingbythe
15		International Border with the Republic of Mexico and the international smuggling
16		that occurs across the border; and
17	WHEREAS,	it is understood and appreciated by the law enforcement agencies of the U.S. that the
