## RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

(Authorizing the Solid Waste Regulatory Office to Assist the United States Environmental Protection Agency in Underground Storage Tank Compliance)

RESOLUTION NO. 03-170

1	WHEREAS,	the United States Environmental Protection Agency ("USEPA") has authority to
2		enforce compliance with federal Underground Storage Tank ("UST") laws and
3		regulations under the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (42 USC 6991-6991i)
4		and its regulations (40 CFR Part 280) on Indian lands; and
5	WHEREAS,	the USEPA seeks to implement its authority on Indian lands by utilizing tribal staff
6		to monitor actions by UST owners and operators to bring their USTs into compliance
7		with federal laws and regulations and USEPA compliance orders; and
8	WHEREAS,	no office of the Nation has been previously designated and authorized to assist the
9		USEPA in performing this compliance monitoring function; and
10	WHEREAS,	the Tohono O'odham Nation created a Solid Waste Regulatory Office ("SWRO") when
11		it adopted the Solid Waste Management Code by Legislative Council Resolution No.
12		97-041, and the SWRO was given authority to enforce the Solid Waste Management
13		Code on Tohono O'odham Nation ("Nation") lands; and
14	WHEREAS,	contaminated soil which is removed during a UST removal is solid waste as defined
15		by the Solid Waste Management Code, and therefore the task of monitoring UST
16		compliance logically fits within duties and responsibilities of the SWRO; and
17	WHEREAS,	the powers and duties of the SWRO listed in Section 302(o) of the Solid Waste
18		Management Code include the power "to exercise such other powers and duties
19		related to solid waste regulation as are described in Chapter 7 and Chapter 9 of this
20		${\bf Code\ and\ as\ shall\ from\ time\ to\ time\ be\ given\ to\ the\ SWRO\ by\ the\ Legislative\ Council;}"$

22	WHEREAS,	it is in the Nation's best interests to designate the SWRO as the office of the Nation
23		with authority to monitor UST compliance activities within the Nation's lands in
24		coordination with the USEPA, and to provide training, advice and technical

2	WHEREAS,	the staff of the SWRO have received training in UST laws and regulations and have
3		experience in monitoring UST removal and compliance activities; and
4	WHEREAS,	this resolution has been reviewed and approved by the Domestic Affairs Committee
5		and the Budget and Finance Committee.
6	NOW, THERE	FORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council authorizes the
7		SWRO to assist the USEPA in monitoring UST compliance activities on the Nation's
8		lands and to provide training, advice and technical assistance to owners and
9		operators of USTs in cooperation with the USEPA, the Inter Tribal Council of Arizona,
10		the Tohono O'odham Nation Environmental Protection Agency and similar entities,
11		and to take such actions as may reasonably be necessary to clean up those USTs on
i		the Nation's lands for which no responsible "owner" or "operator" (as those terms
