RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL (Supporting Consultation and Tribal Participation in FY 2005 BIA Budget Planning)

RESOLUTION NO. 03-180

1	WHEREAS,	tribal governments have worked hard over the past decade to strengthen tribal
2		participation in the planning of the annual Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) budget; and
3	WHEREAS,	the Secretary of the Interior is required by the Indian Reorganization Act of 1934 to
4		consult with tribes regarding the BIA budget; and
5	WHEREAS,	
6		organizations through self-determination contracts, self-governance compacts,
7		schools grants, tribal community college grants, and other grants; and
8	WHEREAS,	
9		separate program elements and subelements and provides funding and services to
10		560 Indian tribes and Alaska Native villages though 12 Regional Offices, 87 Agencies
11		and Field Stations, 185 BIA-funded elementary and secondary schools; 25 tribal
12		community colleges, and various other entities; and
13	WHEREAS,	it is vitally important for tribal governments that the BIA have a strong capability to
14		plan its annual budget and to interact effectively with budget officials in the
15		Department of the Interior (DOI) and the Office of Management and Budget (OMB);
16		and
17	WHEREAS,	the BIA Budget Advisory Council was established three years ago to provide a forum
18		for on-going dialogue between the BIA and tribal governments regarding budget
19		formulation and management; and
20	WHEREAS,	the position of BIA Budget Officer has been filled in the past few years by a Senior
21		Executive Service (SES) level staff person which allows the BIA Budget Officer to
22		interact as a peer with budget officials in the DOI and the OMB; and
23	WHEREAS,	the Deputy Assistant Secretary for Management, Mr. Jim McDivitt has decided to
24		downgrade the position to a GS-15 level, in an attempt to weaken the ability of the BIA
25		to plan its budget; and
26	WHEREAS,	at the same time, Secretary Gale Norton and Assistant Secretary for Policy,
27		Management and Budget Lynn Scarlett have taken a positive interest in the budget
28		of the BIA as indicated by Secretary Scarlett's attendance at the BIA National Budget
29		Meeting in Scottsdale, Arizona in May, 2002; and

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1	WHEREAS,	Mr. Jim McDivitt has provided Secretary Norton and Assistant Secretary Scarlett with
2		advice regarding the BIA budget and trust restructuring that will result in the
3		weakening and further fragmentation of the BIA, which will lead to worse program
4		performance and management; and
5	WHEREAS,	the Acting Budget Officer, Ms. Debby Clark, has only two years' experience in the BIA,
6		does not understand the BIA budget, does not understand tribal governments, does
7		not respect the knowledge and experience of the BIA Regional Budget Officers, and
8		has failed to provide complete and timely guidance on FY 2005 budget formulation;
9		and
10	WHEREAS,	the OMB has developed a new budget planning instrument called the Program
11		Assessment Rating Tool (PART) which has been used to assess the performance and
12		the management of BIA school operations and school construction programs for the
13		purpose of planning the FY 2004 budget request; and
14	WHEREAS,	the DOI has directed the BIA to identify another 20% of the BIA's budget (\$400 million)
15		which will be subject to assessment in FY 2005 using the PART; and
16	WHEREAS,	BIA Regional Office and Agency officials, and tribal governments, should fully
17		participate in the development of baseline data and performance measures for FY
18		2005 budget planning; and
19	WHEREAS,	the BIA will hold its National Budget Meeting in Washington, DC on April 14-16, 2003
20		and will submit its FY 2005 proposed budget to the DOI on May 9, 2003; and
21	WHEREAS,	Mr. Jim McDivitt and Ms. Debby Clark have sought to weaken the BIA Budget Advisory
22		Council, to diminish tribal government participation in the planning of the annual
23		BIA budget, and to dismiss a decade of hard work by tribal and BIA officials to build
24		a more positive and constructive working relationship between tribal governments
25		and the BIA; and
26	WHEREAS,	Ms. Debby Clark continues to raise the issue of unobligated balances but has refused
27		to respond to multiple requests from the BIA Budget Advisory Council to provide a
28		clear summary of the unobligated balances by program, location and amount; and
29	WHEREAS,	Ms. Debby Clark provided to the BIA Budget Advisory Council a table on the FY 2004
30		President's budget request that was misleading and that hid the BIA Central Office's
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1		decisions to cut the funding in FY 2004 for the Indian Self-Determination Fund,
2		Welfare Assistance, the Indian School Equalization Formula (ISEP), tribal community
3		colleges, tribal management/development grants and the trust services center; and
4	WHEREAS,	the BIA's FY 2004 budget request does not reflect the priorities of the tribal
5		governments, the BIA Regional Offices or the BIA Agencies, but does reflect the
6		priorities of Mr. McDivitt; and
7	WHEREAS,	the BIA Budget Advisory Council needs strong participation and leadership from
8		land-based and self-determination tribes in order to prevent the termination of the
9		Federal trust relationship through the trust restructuring process and through the
10		tribal shares process.
11	NOW, THER	EFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Nation:
12		1. Reaffirms its strong support for the mission and the budget of the Bureau of
13		Indian Affairs.
14		2. Calls upon the Deputy Assistant Secretary for Management, Mr. Jim McDivitt, and
15		the Acting Budget Officer, Ms. Debby Clark, to cease their efforts to weaken the
16		ability of the BIA to plan its annual budget, and to cease their efforts to weaken
17		the BIA Budget Advisory Council.
18		3. Calls upon the Acting Assistant Secretary for Indian Affairs to advertise the BIA
19		Budget Officer position at an SES level and to fill the position with someone who
20		understands the operation of BIA programs in the field, who understands the BIA
21		budget and who understands tribal governments.
22		4. Calls upon Ms. Debby Clark to provide a report to tribal governments which
23		displays the FY 2002-2003 unobligated balances by program, location and
24		amount.
25		5. Calls upon Ms. Debby Clark to provide a comprehensive funding table for the FY
26		2004 President's budget request which follows the format that has been used in
27		prior years and which clearly displays the internal transfer, the fixed cost
28		adjustments and the program changes in reference to the FY 2003 enacted
29		amounts.
30		6. Calls upon the Office of Indian Education Programs to provide a report on the
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1	results of the FY 2004 PART analysis of school operations and school construction
2	programs.
3	7. Calls upon Ms. Debby Clark to answer the questions that have been raised by the
4	tribes and the BIA Regional Budget Officers regarding the FY 2005 budget
5	formulation process.
6	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman of the Tohono O'odham Nation is hereby authorized
7	to present this resolution to members of the United States Congress, Department
8	of Interior Officials and other tribal leaders and to take all necessary steps to
9	represent the Nation's position.
10	BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Nation respectfully requests that other
11	sovereign tribal governments support consultation with and participation of
12	tribes in FY 2005 Budget planning.
13	The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council on the <u>10^{TH}.</u> Day
14	of <u>APRIL, 2003</u> at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of <u>2,417.5</u> FOR; <u>-0-</u> AGAINST;
15	<u>-0-</u> NOT VOTING; and [01] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Section 1 (j) of
16	Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'Odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'Odham
17	Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary-Indian Affairs
18	(Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
