## LEGISLATIVE ORDER OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

(Tabling Restructuring of Nation's Election Laws for Six Months to Allow the Districts, Legislative Council Standing Committees, Enrollment Office, Election Board and the Nation's Members Adequate Time for Review)

## LEGISLATIVE ORDER NO. 03-197

1	WHEREAS,	Article X, Section 7 of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation requires that
2		the "Council shall enact an election ordinance $\dots$ which shall prescribe $\dots$ the
3		$registration\ requirements\ for\ voting\ and\ such\ other\ rules\ and\ procedures\ necessary$
4		to the orderly conduct of elections, including but not limited to procedures for
5		validation of petitions and the settlement of any and all election disputes."; and
6	WHEREAS,	the Council did enact the Uniform Election Ordinance ("Election Ordinance"),
7		Ordinance No. 03-86, as described above and which identifies the respective roles of
8		the District Councils and Election Board in registering voters, as well as scheduling
9		and conducting elections; and
10	WHEREAS,	the Election Board did conduct the Nation's 2003 Primary Election on April 26, 2003
11		and has scheduled the 2003 General Election for May 24, 2003 in accordance with the
12		Nation's Constitution and the Election Ordinance; and
13	WHEREAS,	the Legislative Council has received a draft resolution ("Restructuring Resolution")
14		proposing tosubstantiallyalter theelectionprocessbeforethe2003GeneralElection
15		by ordering the Enrollment Office to (1) conduct a voter registration drive among
16		Nation's members who are not registered in any district of the Nation; (2) compile an
17		"Official List of Non- District Registered Voters"; (3) make the "Official List of Non-
18		District Registered Voters" available in all polling places; and (4) establish a polling
19		site in Sonora, Mexico; and
20	WHEREAS,	the Restructuring Resolution further proposes to (1) approve a budget for
21		establishing a polling site in Sonora Mexico; and (2) order the Election Board to delay
22		the 2003 General Election in order to permit the creation of the Enrollment Office's
23		"Official List of Non-District Registered Voters"; and
24	WHEREAS,	the Restructuring Resolution proposes that many of the duties the Election
25		Ordinance expressly delegates to the Election Board or the District Councils would
26		be performed by the Enrollment Office, thereby creating a conflict of laws and
27		substantially altering the conduct of the Nation's elections; and
28	WHEREAS,	the wide range of additional duties, powers, and election procedures the
29		Restructuring Resolution proposes to change are, likewise, governed by existing
30		provisions in the Nation's Constitution, Election Ordinance and Enrollment
