9	WHEREAS,	it is the Nation's interests to protect the safety of the Nation's communities by				
lo		continuing the practice of extraditing persons who are charged with criminal acts,				
11		have  escaped, or  have  violated  any term  of  bail,  probation,  parole,  or  an  order  arising				
12		out of acriminalproceedingtoademandingstateoranothertribaljuris diction; and				
13	WHEREAS,	in the absence of a tribal law governing extraditions, Arizona courts have ruled that				
4		Arizona law enforcement personnel may, in some cases, enter reservation lands and				
15		remove a tribal member without coordinating with tribal law enforcement or				
16		processing the extradition through the tribal court; and				
17	WHEREAS,	in  order  to  protect  the  Nation's  sovereignty  and  ensure  that  Arizona  law  enforcement				
18		personnelabidebytriballawontheTohonoO'odhamNation, it isintheNation'sbest				
19		interests to formalize and make uniform the extradition process and; and				
20	WHEREAS,	the Judiciary Committee has developed the attached Tohono O'odham Nation				
21		Extradition Ordinance after presenting a draft of the Ordinance at public hearings				
22		across the Nation, and soliciting comments from the Districts, Nation's members,				
23		Police Department, Advocate Program, Prosecutor's Office, Judicial Court, Office of				
24		the Attorney General and other entities within the Nation's government; and
