1	WHEREAS,	by Resolution No. 154-90, the Nation increased the employee benefit package in
2		recognition of the need to provide for the Nation's employees and to enhance
3		employee satisfaction and productivity; and
4	WHEREAS,	by Resolution No. 341-90, the Nation established the Employee Benefits Fund for
5		purposes of providing and administering the employee benefit package; and
6	WHEREAS,	by Resolution No. 341-90, the Nation's Personnel Office (now known as the Human
7		Resources Office) was directed to implement contracts of insurance with designated
8		companies for specific aspects of the employee benefit package, and to administer
9		each element of the employee benefit package; and
10	WHEREAS,	by Resolution No. 91-017, the Nation approved contracts of insurance for provision
11		of workmen's compensation, general liability, property, police professional liability
12		and public officials errors and omissions insurance for a three year period; and
13	WHEREAS,	through subsequent annual budget approvals, the employee benefit package has
14		been funded at a rate of 30% of employee salaries, as opposed to the 28% rate
15		established in Resolution No. 154-90; and
16	WHEREAS,	the Human Resources Office has negotiated contracts of insurance with carriers for
17		types of insurance and in amounts different than those identified in Resolution No.
18		341-90 and 91-017; and
19	WHEREAS,	the Human Resources Office has extended participation in the employee benefit
20		package to the Nation's Districts and to certain of the Nation's subordinate economic
21		enterprises such as the Nation's Community College and the Nursing Care Authority;
22		and
23	WHEREAS,	the Human Resources Office has extended liability insurance coverage to the Nation's
24		Districts and to certain of the Nation's subordinate economic enterprises; and
25	WHEREAS,	by Resolution No. 00-453, the Nation approved a 401(k) Pension Plan as the
26		retirement plan for employees in satisfaction of the requirement of Resolution No.
27		154-90 to provide a retirement plan as part of the employee benefit package; and
28	WHEREAS,	Section 125 of the Internal Revenue Code, 26 U.S.C. § 125, authorizes a taxpayer to
