5	WHEREAS,	the Chair wo man of the Tohono O'odham Nation has determined that these buildings
6		are needed for occupancy by the Executive Branch and has formally requested the
7		transfer of the title for Quarters No. 24 and No. 25 to the Nation; and
8	WHEREAS,	the BIA requires a Tribal Resolution to complete the transfer of the buildings
9		described as:
10		1. Government Furnished Quarters No. 24, two-bedroom house with 1,371 square
11		feet, that is located within the BIA facility compound in Sells. Housing is
12		unfurnished with concrete slab on grade with standard equipment that will stay
13		with house are hot water heater, heating furnace, gas meter and refrigerator.
14		2. Government Furnished Garage building No. 25 with 648 square feet that is also
15		located within the BIA facility compound in Sells.
16	NOW, THER	EFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council approves the
17		transfer of federal government furnished Quarters No. 24 and No. 25 that is
18		located within the BIA Facility Compound in Sells to the Tohono O'odham Nation
19		for its use.
20	BE IT FINAL	LY RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council hereby recommends that
21		the Chairwoman of the Nation secure all necessary documentation to complete
22		its transfer, and authorize the Chairwoman to execute any such documents on
23		behalf of the Nation.
