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	WHEREAS,	our ancestors, the Hohokam made extensive use of these lands, leaving evidence at
4		hundreds of archaeological sites located within the Los Robles Archaeological
5		District, nominated and listed on the National Register of Historic Places; and
6	WHEREAS,	these sites include villages, farming sites, resource procurement sites, petroglyph
7		sites, ceremonial sites and burial sites sacred to the O'odham; and
8	WHEREAS,	the Tohono O'odham Nation recognizes the importance and need to protect, preserve
9		and manage cultural and natural resources on the Nation's lands and on these
10		traditional-use lands located in Pinal County; and
11	WHEREAS,	the Tohono O'odham Nation is concerned over the numerous alleged environmental
12		violations by the La Osa Development being investigated by various federal and state
13		agencies including the destruction and damage of Hohokam archaeological sites;
14		and
15	WHEREAS,	the Tohono O'odham Nation is concerned over short-term, long-term, direct and
16		indirect impacts from the La Osa Development on the Ironwood National Monument
17		and its many significant cultural and natural resources; and
18	WHEREAS,	the Tohono O'odham Nation is concerned that no adequate environmental studies
19		have been completed for this proposed La Osa Development; and
20	WHEREAS,	the Tohono O'odham Nation is concerned that this developer has a history of
21		environmental violations, including previous citations and fines from the Arizona
22		Department of Environmental Quality in Pinal and Apache Counties; and
23	WHEREAS,	the Tohono O'odham Nation is concerned that the La Osa Development may
24		channelize the Santa Cruz River and thereby cause impacts on the Tohono O'odham
25		Nation due to downstream flooding in the Chuichu area of the Sif Oidak District and
26		in other non-Indian Irrigation Districts and Flood Control Districts.
27	NOW, THEF	REFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council does hereby
