(Supporting the United States in Defending a Freedom of Information Act Lawsuit to Prevent Release of the Nation's Information on Pygmy-Owls)

WHEREAS, a land development company called Tangerine Road Associates in Tucson has filed

2		a Freedom of Information Act lawsuit against the United States Fish and Wildlife
3		Service in federal district court, Case No. CIV 02 614 TUC WDB, seeking to obtain
4		copies of pygmy-owl detection forms which were submitted to the United States in
5		compliance with protocols under the federal Endangered Species Act by consultants
6		working within the Nation's lands; and
7	WHEREAS,	the Tohono O'odham Nation has objected to releasing these detection forms to the
8		plaintiffs in the Tangerine Road lawsuit because the detection forms contain
9		information regarding the specific locations of pygmy-owls, and the Nation takes the
10		position that, based on the religious belief of O'odham, information about owls
11		should not be released to the public because owls are to be respected and not
12		disturbed; and
13	WHEREAS,	the Tohono O'odham believe that releasing information about owl locations
14		interferes with the O'odham duty to protect owls on the lands of the Nation; and
15	WHEREAS,	the Chairwoman of the Nation and Jefford Francisco have submitted affidavits as an
16		exhibit to the United States' brief which explain the O'odham religious belief
17		regarding a duty to respect and protect owls; and
18	WHEREAS,	the Cultural Preservation Committee of the Legislative Council and the Chairwoman
19		of the Nation have reviewed the matter and recommend that the Nation continue to
20		oppose the release of the information regarding owl locations.
21	NOW, THE	REFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council
22		supports the efforts of the United States to defend the lawsuit brought by Tangerine
23		Road Associates to prevent the release of information about owl locations on the
24		Nation's lands.
25	BE IT FUI	RTHER RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council authorizes
26		the Chairwoman of the Nation, in consultation with the Cultural Preservation
27		Committee of the Legislative Council, to consider settlement of the lawsuit if it is in
28		the Nation's best interest for the United States to settle the case.
