

RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
(Approving the U.S. Department of Justice 2002 State Domestic Preparedness
Program Grant in the amount of \$56,816.00)

RESOLUTION NO. 04-196

1 **WHEREAS, the United States Department of Justice has distributed grants to counties, through**
2 **their respective states, to fund equipment purchases by departments that provide**
3 **public safety services within their respective jurisdictions; and**

4 **WHEREAS, the State of Arizona has allocated \$1,564,614.35 of fiscal year 2002 Homeland Security**
5 **grants to Pima County for distribution as a grant to County jurisdictions; and**

6 **WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation's allocation is \$56,816.00 for equipment purchases; and**

7 **WHEREAS, Indian tribes have been designated to receive funds through the counties, requiring**
8 **tribes to enter into Intergovernmental Agreements with counties; and**

9 **WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation has negotiated an Intergovernmental Agreement with**
10 **Pima County for \$56,816.00 on a reimbursement basis to finance equipment**
11 **purchases by the Tohono O'odham Nation Department of Public Safety for a specific**
12 **list of equipment designated by the Intergovernmental Agreement and requests a**
13 **Waiver of Indirect Costs associated with administering this grant; and**

14 **WHEREAS, the authorized equipment purchases categories are Personal Protective Equipment**
15 **(PPE), Detection Equipment, Decontamination Equipment, and General Support**
16 **Equipment; and**

17 **WHEREAS, the Agreement has been reviewed and approved by the Office of the Attorney General,**
18 **Executive Committee, Domestic Affairs Committee, Budget & Finance Committee, and**
19 **therefore said committees recommend approval by the Legislative Council.**

20 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council approves the**
21 **above-mentioned Intergovernmental Agreement with Pima County for \$56,816.00 on**
22 **a reimbursement basis for the purchase of equipment under the United States**
23 **Department of Justice 2002 State Domestic Preparedness Grant and approves a**
24 **Waiver of Indirect Cost to administer this grant; and**

25 **BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that the Tohono O'odham Nation Department of Public Safety is**
26 **authorized to expend funds from this grant in the amount of \$56,816.00 beginning**
27 **May 1, 2002 through July 31, 2004.**

28 **The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council on the 06TH Day**
29 **of MAY, 2004 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 2,629.7 FOR; -0- AGAINST;**
30 **-0- NOT VOTING; and [04] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Section 1 (f) of**
31 **Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'Odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'Odham**

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Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
