RESOLUTION NO. 04-632

1	WHEREAS,	the Tohono O'odham Nation ("Nation"), in exercise of its sovereign authority, desires
2		to manage and regulate the storage, collection, recycling, transportation and
3		disposal of solid waste and certain hazardous waste on lands within the boundaries
4		of the Tohono O'odham Nation (Nation) in order to protect the Nation's environment,
5		its natural resources, the political integrity and economic security, and the health,
6		safety and welfare of its members and all persons present on the lands of the Nation;
7		and
8	WHEREAS,	the United States Congress adopted legislation in the form of <i>The Indian Lands Open</i>
9		Dump Clean-up Act of 1994, 25 USC section 3901-3908, requiring the Indian Health
10		Service to provide technical and financial assistance for the closure of all solid waste
11		dumps on Indian Lands; and
12	WHEREAS,	the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council ("Legislative Council") adopted the Solid
13		Waste Management Code and Solid Waste Management Plan on February 12, 1997
14		(Resolution 97-041); and from FY-1997 through FY-2004 the Legislative Council has
15		approved the operating budgets for the Solid Waste Management Program to
16		establish and manage a reservation-wide solid waste and recycling collection and
17		disposal program; and
18	WHEREAS,	a detailed cost analysis of the cleaning and closing of all 113 dump sites, entitled
19		Closure and Post-Closure Plan Tohono O'odham Nation Open Dumpsites (August, 15,
20	·	2000) was presented to the Legislative Council and estimated at \$6,200,000; and
21	WHEREAS,	the Nation has applied for and has received a total of \$1,934,000.00 to date from the
22		I.H.S. Sanitary Deficiency Fund and the Federal Interagency Solid Waste Task Force
23		for cleaning up and closing the solid waste dumps; and the Nation will continue to
24		apply for additional funds for closure as long as funds are available; and
25	WHEREAS,	the Tohono O'odham Solid Waste Management Code directs that the Solid Waste
26		Regulatory Office and the Solid Waste Management Program to close all dump sites
27		making sure to conform to all applicable environmental standards.
28	NOW, THER	EFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that current and future Indian Health Service funds, Federal
29		Interagency Solid WasteTaskForcefundsandothergrantfundsearmarkedfordump

4	expenditure of \$415,634.29 for FY-2005 in accordance with the attached budget.						
5	BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that subsequent funding for solid waste dump clean up and closures is						
6	wholly dependant upon continued funding from Indian Health Services funds,						
7	Interagency Solid Waste Task Force funds and other grant funds, and there will be no						
8	obligation for funding by the Tohono O'odham Nation.
