

**RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
(Amending Resolution 04-539, "U.S. Department of Justice 2002 State Domestic
Preparedness Program Grant")**

RESOLUTION NO. 05-192

1 **WHEREAS, the United States Department of Justice has distributed grants to counties, through**
2 **their respective states, to fund equipment purchases by departments that provide**
3 **public safety services within their respective jurisdictions; and**

4 **WHEREAS, Indian tribes have been designated to receive funds through the counties, requiring**
5 **tribes to enter into Intergovernmental Agreements with counties; and**

6 **WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation has negotiated an Intergovernmental Agreement with**
7 **Pima County for \$56,816.00 on a reimbursement basis to finance equipment**
8 **purchases by the Tohono O'odham Nation Department of Public Safety for a specific**
9 **list of equipment designated by the Intergovernmental Agreement; and**

10 **WHEREAS, the authorized equipment purchases categories are Personal Protective Equipment**
11 **(PPE), Detection Equipment, Decontamination Equipment, and General Support**
12 **Equipment; and**

13 **WHEREAS, the Agreement has been reviewed and approved by the Tohono O'odham Nation**
14 **Legislative Council the unencumbered carryover amount of \$34,591.08; extension**
15 **beginning October 1, 2004 through January 31, 2005; Resolution 04-539; and**

16 **WHEREAS, the adjusted actual carryover amount was \$34,411.58 of the DOJ Grant program**
17 **period ending January 31, 2005; and**

18 **WHEREAS, the request to approve the DOJ Grant adjusted actual carryover amount of \$34,411.58**
19 **has been reviewed and approved by the appropriate committees.**

20 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council approves the**
21 **amendment to Resolution 04-539 and authorizes the adjusted actual carryover**
22 **amount of \$34,411.58 of the United States Department of Justice 2002 State Domestic**
23 **Preparedness Grant.**

24 **BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Nation Department of Safety is authorized to**
25 **expend the adjusted actual unencumbered funds from this grant beginning October**
26 **1, 2004 through January 31, 2005.**

27 **The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council on the 07TH. Day**
28 **of APRIL, 2005 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 2,629.7 FOR; -0- AGAINST;**
29 **-0- NOT VOTING; and [03] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Section 1 (f) of**
30 **Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'Odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'Odham**
31 **Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs**
32 **(Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).**






