

RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
(Approval of the FY 05 DOJ STOP Violence Against Indian Women Discretionary
Grant Budget Modification)

RESOLUTION NO. 05-336

1 **WHEREAS, the Tohono O'odham Nation has been administering a STOP Violence Against Indian**
2 **Women Discretionary Grant to coordinate and plan domestic violence services; and**

3 **WHEREAS, the project budget was allocated across various tribal programs (Tohono O'odham**
4 **Department of Human Services, Tohono O'odham Police Department, Victim Witness**
5 **and Judicial Branch) and non-tribal partners (Brewster Center of Tucson) per the**
6 **requirements of the grant; and**

7 **WHEREAS, Tohono O'odham Police Department and Victim Witness wish to transfer funds**
8 **planned for salaries and fringe benefits for existing staff positions to other line items**
9 **to support coordination, training, capacity building and education materials; and**

10 **WHEREAS, the Salaries and Fringe Benefits line items were decreased by a total of \$29,653.00; and**

11 **WHEREAS, line items for Public Relations and Food were added to the budget at a total of**
12 **\$6,163.00; and**

13 **WHEREAS, the remaining seven line items were increased by a total of \$24,342.06; and**

14 **WHEREAS, the Indirect Cost line item was reduced by \$852.06.**

15 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:**

- 16 **1. The Tohono O'odham Legislative Council hereby approves the attached budget**
17 **modification as outlined, which maintains the original budget total of \$74,709.**
- 18 **2. The Nation has requested a no-cost extension of this budget from the U.S.**
19 **Department of Justice from the original completion date of June 30, 2005 to**
20 **December 31, 2005 in order to complete the scope of work and expend all funds**
21 **awarded.**
- 22 **3. The Tohono O'odham Nation officials, to wit: the Chairwoman and Vice Chairman**
23 **and any designated official are hereby authorized to negotiate and execute the**
24 **Inter Governmental Agreement and expend funds.**

25 **The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council on the 9TH. Day**
26 **of JUNE, 2005 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 2,273.4 FOR; -0- AGAINST;**
27 **-0- NOT VOTING; and 167.4 [05] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Section**
28 **1 (f) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'Odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono**
29 **O'Odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary -**
30 **Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48**
31 **Stat. 984).**


