RESOLUTION NO. <u>05-450</u>

1	WHEREAS, American Indians have the lowest enrollment rates in higher education of all minority
2	groups; and
3	WHEREAS, American Indians in Arizona represent 3.6% of the higher education population while
4	they are more than 5% of the state enrollment; and
5	WHEREAS, Tribal communities are expanding their role in the competitive arena of a market
6	driven economy; and
7	WHEREAS, Tribal needs are expanding in matters concerning the welfare of it's members, well-
8	being of its youth and security of it's most valued members - it's elderly; and
9	WHEREAS, American Indian students will, in the future, develop infrastructure that promotes
10	healthy communities and be leaders in the retention, preservation and advancement
11	of Tohono O'odham Himdag; and
12	WHEREAS, in the past there has been a lack of sustained and firmly constructed collaboration
13	between tribes in Arizona and state institutions of higher education; and
14	WHEREAS, the Arizona Tri-Universities for Indian Education has caused to come about strategies
15	and a call to action to improve higher education for Indian People in Arizona.
16	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council and the Nation's
17	Executive Office endorse and support the concepts and purposes of "Bridging
18	Institutions of Higher Education and American Indian Nations in Arizona."
19	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairwoman or person she designates to actively seek
20	methods to institutionalize systemic approaches to afford tribal members equal and
21	meaningful opportunities in higher education.
22	BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Nation agrees with the inclusion of
23	tribal perspectives and participation in the academic planning and delivery processes
24	that seeks to enhances social and cultural enlightenment.

Day of <u>AUGUST</u> , <u>2005</u> at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of <u>2,247.0</u> FOR; <u>-0-AGAINST</u> ; <u>-0-NOT VOTING</u> ; and <u>193.8 [08]</u> ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by Section 1 (c)(2) & (f) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'Odham Nation, adopted by the Tohono O'Odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
