

RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
(Approval to accept U.S. EPA Grant Award of \$41,500 for the Creation of a Household Hazardous Waste Clean-up Project)

RESOLUTION NO. 05-561

1 **WHEREAS, Article XVIII of the Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation sets out the Council's**
2 **continuing responsibility to assure for all members safe and healthful surroundings; and**

3 **WHEREAS, the lands of the Tohono O'odham Nation have been severely impacted by the improper**
4 **disposal of household hazardous waste in the form of used oil, paint, solvents, fuel,**
5 **pesticides, cleaners, and other materials by residents; and**

6 **WHEREAS, the Solid Waste Management Program (SWMP) is tasked with the removal of solid waste**
7 **and certain hazardous wastes from the Nation's lands; and**

8 **WHEREAS, the U.S. EPA has awarded \$41,500 to the Tohono O'odham SWMP to train staff, purchase**
9 **equipment and supplies to enable the SWMP to provide all residents on the Nation's land**
10 **the education, information and services that will enable the proper collection,**
11 **transportation, storage and disposal of household hazardous waste.**


12 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council hereby approves**
13 **the acceptance of \$41,500 from the US EPA for the Household Hazardous Waste Clean-up**
14 **Project.**

15 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tohono O'odham Nation Legislative Council that the Tohono**
16 **O'odham Nation's Official, to wit: the Chairwoman, Vice Chairman and any designated**
17 **person are hereby authorized to negotiate and execute the grant, provided however, that**
18 **any amendments affecting the funding levels of the grant shall be submitted for further**
19 **prior approval.**

20 **BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that the Solid Waste Management Program is authorized to expend funds**
21 **from this grant as detailed in the attached budget.**

22 **The foregoing Resolution was passed by the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council on the 27TH Day**
23 **of SEPTEMBER, 2005 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 2,440.80 FOR; -0-**
24 **AGAINST; -0- NOT VOTING; and [-0-] ABSENT, pursuant to the powers vested in the Council by**
25 **Section 1 (f) of Article VI of the Constitution of the Tohono O'Odham Nation, adopted by the**
26 **Tohono O'Odham Nation on January 18, 1986; and approved by the Acting Deputy Assistant**
27 **Secretary - Indian Affairs (Operations) on March 6, 1986, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June**
28 **18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).**
