12	WHEREAS,	while the Nation generally supports these four priority areas, these priority areas do				
13		not encompass all of the programs that are critical for the Nation's members; and

22		Development, including the Reservation Roads Program, is part of the United States'				
23		trust responsibilities to American Indians.				
24	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council does hereby					
25		request that the list of Budget Priority topics include Human Services and Welfare				
26		Assistance and the Reservation Roads Program as additional priority areas for fiscal and the reservation and the
